About Prevention

The Primary Prevention Team is a program within Children's Division designed to connect families with meaningful resources before child maltreatment occurs. Our goal is to work with community partners and empower families so that children can be raised with and by their natural supports whenever possible.





What will primary prevention look like?

Primary prevention will:

- Work with families who may be facing a crisis to create solutions before it becomes a safety concern
- Help families find community services, programs and family supports
- Connect with families to reduce concerns that may lead to a hotline
- Partner with community agencies to identify and address service gaps

What can you do?

- Support children and families to set them up for success
- **Collaborate with Children's Division prevention team** to connect families with community services
- Include the prevention team in community meetings to improve family support
- **Involve a prevention team member** when families are open to assistance from the Children's Division
