

The Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services has joined the National Healthy Mothers, Healthy Babies (HMHB) Coalition in a public-private partnership to provide text4baby, a national campaign to promote maternal and child health by offering free text messages to pregnant women and new moms. Missouri women who sign up for the service by texting BABY to 511411 (or BEBE in Spanish) will receive free text messages each week, timed to their due date or baby's date of birth. Messages focus on a variety of critical maternal and child health topics, including birth defects prevention, immunization, nutrition, seasonal flu, mental health, oral health, and the safest ways for babies to sleep. Text4baby messages also connect women to prenatal and infant care services and other resources in Missouri.

The HMHB Coalition specializes in promoting optimal health for mothers and babies by creating partnerships among nonprofit organizations, professional associations, businesses and government agencies. The text4baby partnership includes the White House Office on Science and Technology Policy and the U. S. Department of Health and Human Services as well as the text4baby wireless carriers who are voluntarily distributing text messages to recipients free of charge. Missouri is proud to be a text4baby partner. By putting timely health information directly into the hands of pregnant women and new moms, text4baby can have a significant impact on maternal and child health in Missouri.

Encourage the pregnant women and new moms you know - clients, customers, patients as well as family members - to sign up for text4baby and receive three free text messages each week encouraging them to care for their health and give their babies the best possible start in life.
