- Discussed the PIP Measurement Plan

#### Areas of Coverage:

Kansas City

St Louis County and City

Northeast circuits 13th and 20th

Southeast 24th, 25th and 36th

Southwest 29th and 31<sup>st</sup>

All cases for the PIP goals come from these areas. There is a total of 40 cases. 27 of them are with children in Foster Care and 13 In-Home cases.

- Reviewed Case Review Criteria
- CFSR Items:  
PIP monitoring occurs for seven items. Safety Items 1-3 are the most problematic based on ongoing case reviews. Well-Being Items are 12-15. We will be doing all 18.

- Case Review Data Discussion

Janet brought up a case example. Katie advised Janet to obtain more details about that specific case to find the why it was listed as successful or unsuccessful.

- Discussed ANI (Areas that Needs Improvement) and Well-Being Outcomes.

Chelsea-Advised that it can be frustrating when the case goal is required to be changed from reunification due to 15 months or more with no parent involvement. If they change the goal to adoption but there is no resource listed for adoption, then this would be marked as not an

appropriate goal and count negatively on the review. This is getting a mark for ANI, so they need direction to know what to do in these circumstances. Is there a better option?

Concern was brought up that we need to make sure all the reviewers are looking for the same things.

Our highest ratings are in Placing siblings together.

Look into the reason for St Louis showing fewer relative placements.

Case Reviews look a lot at the quality of the visits with do vs just pulling the numbers per HB 1414 which looks more at quantity.

Discussed #18 and what may be leading to such a jump in the percentage.

JoDene looking deeper into what is reflecting to the WHY into improvements.

Another new focus (#16) is focusing on permanency is 12 months.

Katie asked if there was any updates or things to share?

- 5 new people are getting trained in September to become Case Reviewers
