\*\* Incidents that require a report from the child care provider include, but are not limited to: • The death of a child if the child died while in a child care setting as defined by Missouri Statute. • A serious injury that occurs in a child care setting as defined by Missouri Statute that results in the child getting professional medical treatment. • The death of a child, that received care in a child care setting as defined by the Missouri Statute, if the child died of a contagious disease.

\*\*\* Substantiated Child Abuse and Neglect reports. The Children's Division uses **Preponderance of Evidence** as the standard of proof that abuse or neglect has occurred. This is the degree of evidence that is of greater weight or more convincing than the evidence which is offered in opposition to it or evidence which as a whole shows the fact to be proved to be more probable than not.
