

## **Fostering a NORMAL Childhood**

The *Reasonable and Prudent Parent Standard* is a law that requires caregivers to make responsible choices that prioritize a child's health, safety, and overall well-being. The ultimate goal is to promote the child's emotional and developmental growth. According to federal law, children in foster care deserve a life that is similar to a typical family and home environment, which means that normal activities, such as extracurricular, social, cultural, and other enriching activities, should be included in daily life.

## Foster Parents must encourage healthy activities such as:



Extracurricular clubs, sports, School, camps, and field-trips



Driver's Education and recreational vehicle use



Youth Group Activities and Parties and sleepovers



Vacations (with the resource parents)



Self-care/hygiene practices or temporary changes to appearance



Outings with peers (including dating, if appropriate)
