SCHOOL-LINKED PROGRAMS

After School Programs and Mentoring

- Strategy to keep kids safe, drug-free and prepared for school and life
- After school clubs and mentoring programs provided in 10 Title 1 schools
- 631 students served through Bulldog Basketball Academy, small group and one-on-one mentoring, SAAB, and after school clubs.

MSOM

Our *Making Sense of Money* Program teaches basic budgeting. Participants set savings goals and receive a match when they reach their goal.

VITA

Our *VITA* program helps prepare taxes for those in need. Last year 4,980 returns were prepared bringing in over \$4.6 million!

School-Based Social Work



Resources

Connect families to needed resources such as food, housing, mental and physical health, child care, clothing, transportation and other needs.

Educational Needs

Assist students with accessing tutoring and removing attendance barriers to help achieve academic success.

Mentoring

Provide mentoring to students and families to improve emotional well-being and social skills. Meet with families to manage the stresses of life.

Advocacy

Act as a connection between family, school and community to better support the overall well-being of the student and family.

Community Outreach

Community Wide Play Day

- Partner with 40+ agencies to provide fun, age-appropriate activities at no cost to families
- Serves 1000+ children (0-12 years old) and their families each year
- Every child receives a free book

CAPABLE KIDS AND FAMILIES

A free support program for families with children aged 0-6 living with a developmental delay or disability

Services Include:

- Monthly Home Visits
- Therapy Equipment Loan Program
- Network Meetings / Playgroups



Child Care Support

Over 100 child care providers/classrooms served and 1,100 children birth to 5 impacted

Training, coaching and technical assistance provided

Improves school readiness, promotes developmental development, improves health and safety

PREVENTION RESOURCE CENTER



- Needs assessments, training, and technical assistance for coalitions
- \$768,000+ in mini-grant funding for coalitions
- Focused on decreasing substance misuse, especially among youth

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MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID AND SUICIDE PREVENTION

Capacity Building Efforts

- Provide Mental Health and Youth Mental Health First Aid trainings in Greene County
- Help reduce the stigma around mental health
- We also provide Signs of Suicide trainings for our local school districts



Medication Take-Back Events



- 6,980 pounds were collected across the region last year
- Since 2012, our Drug Take Back events have collected 86,186 pounds of medications



**AFFORDABLE HOUSING AND
HOMELESS PREVENTION**

SPRINGFIELD COMMUNITY LAND TRUST

- This program allows qualified buyers to purchase homes while the land beneath the home belongs to the Springfield Community Land Trust
- The homeowner holds rights to the land by paying a fee through a lease-hold agreement
- Homes within the program are typically remodeled or new construction homes that are energy efficient and equipped with new appliances and other amenities



Bringing innovation and collaboration together to identify the needs of the homeless in our community to address recommendations and meet goals within our 10 Year Plan to End Homelessness



Responsible for ensuring over \$1 million in HUD dollars are secured annually to support emergency and transitional housing providers, domestic violence shelters, and substance abuse recovery centers.



O'Reilly Center for Hope

The O'Reilly Center for Hope serves as a community hub that brings together multiple partner agencies in support of affordable housing, financial stability, and the overall well-being of our community.

In 2022 we served 4,342 different guests and made 16,213 referrals within the Center
