Gift Aid

Student does not have to repay

Scholarship:

Based on academic merit

Grant: Based on need or special purpose

Loans

Student must repay, typically with interest

Federal

State


Private

FAFSA: Free Application for Federal Student Aid

- Federal aid application (Pell, loans)
- State aid application for some programs
 - Used to determine need/other eligibility criteria



Grant/Loan Conversion: Grant becomes a loan if specified criteria not met





- General Eligibility Criteria
 - U.S. citizen/permanent resident
 - Some programs include those lawfully present in U.S.
 - Missouri resident
 - Undergraduate student attending a participating Missouri institution
 - Not be pursing a degree/certificate in theology or divinity

Some programs may not include all general criteria/ others may have additional criteria

Spotlight on Access Missouri



Access Missouri

- Missouri's primary need-based grant
- Need based on Expected Family Contribution (EFC) from FAFSA
- Awards designed to be simple, predictable and portable

	Public 2-Year	Public 4-Year, State Tech, Private, Approved Virtual (WGU)	
Statutory Maximum	\$1,300	\$2,850	
Statutory Minimum	\$300	\$1,500	

Access Missouri Awards

- Annual maximums typically less than statutory
- Awards based on:
 - Number of eligible students
 - Program appropriation
- Structure
 - EFC/Type of Institution Matrix
 - EFCs in \$500 ranges from \$0-500 to \$11,500-\$12,000
 - Awards higher for students with lower EFCs

Access Missouri Eligibility

- U.S. Citizen or permanent resident
- Missouri resident
- Full-time (12 hours), undergraduate student
- Expected Family Contribution (EFC) of \$12,000 or less
- File the FAFSA
 - Feb. 1 preferred, April 1 final deadline. Actual award deadline can be set anywhere in between.
 - Corrections by July 31
- 2.5 cumulative GPA to renew



Access Missouri Eligibility

- Eligibility expires on earliest of:
 - Receipt of the award for 10 semesters
 - Receipt of 1st bachelor's degree
 - Completion of the required hours for a bachelor's degree
 - Completion of 150 semester credit hours



Access Missouri

- FY 2023
 - \$9 M appropriation increase
 - Full funding at statutory maximum award levels and April 1 deadline



Spotlight on Fast Track




- Addresses state's workforce needs
- Targeted toward adults
- Assistance in pursuing a certificate, degree, or industry recognized credential in a designated high need area
- Need-based grant
 - AGI of \$80,000 or less if married filing jointly
 - AGI of \$40,000 or less for all other tax filing statuses




 Prior to Aug. 28, 2022 grant could convert to loan if not a MO resident/employed in MO for 3 years

after graduation





- SB 672 effective August 28, 2022
 - All loan-related requirements eliminated



- Recipients must still report 3 years of residency/employment
- Program expanded to include additional eligible training providers and apprenticeships

FY 2023 Fast Track Awards

Student Award:

Tuition and fees

Governmental sources of funding (state or federal non-loan) Award

If calculated award is zero, student can receive lesser of remaining cost of attendance or \$500

Apprentice Award:

Related educational costs (tools, uniforms, etc.)

Governmental sources of funding (state or federal non-loan)

Award



- Level appropriation of \$4.7 M for FY 2023
- Expected to be sufficient but exact impact of expansion and removal of the loan requirements uncertain





A+

- Scholarships to eligible graduates of A+ designated high school to attend a participating public community college or vocational/technical schools, or certain private two-year vocational/technical schools
- Students must meet high school requirements and postsecondary renewal requirements
- Awards based on tuition and fees remaining after federal non-loan aid (Pell) is applied

Bright Flight

- Merit-based scholarship encouraging top-ranked high school seniors to attend approved MO postsecondary schools with tiered awards
- Top 3% = ACT 31 for 2022 seniors; ACT 32 for 2023+ seniors up to \$3,000 annually
- Top 4th & 5th percentiles = ACT 30 for 2022 seniors; ACT 31 for 2023+ seniors up to \$1,000 annually
 - FY 2023 will be first year top 4th & 5th percentiles (2018-2022 graduates) funded



Dual Credit/ Enrollment

- Scholarship to assist high school students cover tuition and fees for dual credit/dual enrollment courses
- First implemented spring 2022; tied to A+; need-sensitive
- 2022 legislative changes (SB 718) removed A+ tie; need-based effective 8/28/22

MUELP

- Scholarship to assist academically talented minority and underrepresented individuals pursuing a bachelor's or master's degree in an environmental course of study leading to employment in a field clearly environmentally-related
- Awards selected by statutorily-defined selection committee
- Award calculated by dividing appropriation among selected recipients



Wartime Veteran's Survivor

- •Grant for children/spouses of veterans whose deaths or injuries were a result of combat action or attributed to an illness contracted while serving in combat action, or who became 80% disabled as a result of injuries/accidents sustained in combat since 9/11/2001
- •If child, available through semester of 25th birthday
- Statutorily limited to 25 recipients/year
- •Semester awards based on tuition/fees capped at UMC rate + 2,000 room & board allowance + actual book costs up to \$500

Public Safety Officer Survivor

- •Grant providing tuition assistance to certain public employees and their families if the employee is killed or permanently and totally disabled in the line of duty
- •If child, available through semester of 24th birthday
- •Award capped at tuition for 12 hours and UMC tuition rate



Kids' Chance

- Scholarship for children of workers/families receiving worker's compensation for a serious injury or death that occurred on the job
- Partnership with Kids' Chance Inc. of Missouri
- Award lesser of actual tuition/fees capped at UMC rate, or maximum award provided by Kids' Chance Inc. of Missouri

Advanced Placement Incentive Grant

- One-time \$500 grant encouraging high school students to take and score well on Advanced Placement tests in math and science
- Must achieve two scores of 3 or higher on math or science AP exams while at a Missouri public high school
- Must also receive an Access Missouri or A+ award, or be eligible for a \$0 award



Application

 For most programs, application is on MDHEWD Student Portal/Estimate Eligibility tab

- Not required for Bright Flight or Access Missouri
 - Bright Flight eligibility based on ACT score received from ACT Inc.
 - Access Missouri eligibility is based on FAFSA received from U.S. Department of Education
