

Missouri Network of Child Advocacy Centers (CACs)



What is a Child Advocacy Center?

- CACs are safe and child-focused places that serve as the foundation of the investigation and prosecution of child physical and sexual abuse in Missouri. CACs coordinate the multi-disciplinary (MDT) investigations of child abuse, providing forensic, medical, therapeutic, and case management services as part of a multidisciplinary response to child abuse allegations.
- Services provided at CACs:
 - Forensic interviews
 - Victim advocacy to help families navigate the legal response and access resources
 - Evidence-based mental health services
 - MDT case management
 - Sexual assault and physical abuse forensic medical evaluations (some locations)

Missouri KidsFirst: Missouri Network of Child Advocacy Centers

- **Missouri KidsFirst** serves as the statewide association for Missouri's CACs, coordinating funding, providing training and technical assistance, and raising awareness of the prevention of and services for child abuse.
- Training for forensic interviewers, victim advocates, multidisciplinary team members (Children's Division, law enforcement, prosecutors, juvenile office), medical and mental health providers and community members.

Sexual Assault Forensic Examination-Child Abuse Resource and Education



The coordinated medical response to child abuse and neglect in Missouri. Through a partnership with DHSS, Missouri KidsFirst and its partners at Missouri's three Child Abuse Medical Resource Centers (Children's Mercy, St. Louis Children's and Cardinal Glennon), accomplish the program's mission through the following activities:

- Provide annual training for physicians, advanced practice nurses, and physician assistants on the forensic evaluation and comprehensive medical care of children who may have suffered physical or sexual abuse
- Provide mentorship, support, and ongoing education for a network of providers that take an active role in providing these services to children in their communities
- Empower multidisciplinary team members to better recognize and respond to child abuse and neglect through education on injury mechanics/plausibility, sentinel injuries, and other medical aspects of child abuse and neglect
