Helping teens and young adults develop the work skills they need to build a career



## What is Jobs League?

The Jobs League Program can help teens and young adults get paid on-the-job training that ultimately helps them develop the work skills they need to build a career. Jobs League will work with you to find your interests, build your career plan, and resume, and help you find a job. You can participate up to 320 hours per state fiscal year (July 1 - June 30).

## Who is eligible?

To be eligible for the Jobs League program, you must:

- Be between the ages of 14 and 24
- Live in Missouri
- Meet the monthly gross income requirements for your household (Below 185% of the Federal Poverty Level)
