

Transitional Child Care Information for Families

When your income goes above the limit for the Child Care Subsidy Program, the state may still pay a portion of your child care costs through Transitional Child Care.

Transitional Child Care allows you to ease into paying for child care on your own. The amount you pay will depend on your income and which level of Transitional Child Care you qualify for.



How will I know if I am getting Transitional Child Care?

You will receive a letter from the Family Support Division that will tell you:

- The date your Child Care Subsidy will change to Transitional Child Care Subsidy
- The amount the Family Support Division will pay the provider for the child in care
- The amount you pay directly to the childcare provider (known as a sliding fee)
- The date your Transitional Child Care Subsidy ends

What if I still need help paying for child care?

If your Transitional Child Care ends soon and you still need help, you can reapply. We will automatically mail you an application before your benefit ends. Once you get this, you will need to:

- Complete the application
- Return it to your local Family Support Division Resource Center before the end date on your letter

If you do not get an application to reapply at least 30 days before your subsidy ends, call **855-FSD-INFO (855-373-4636)** to ask for one. **If you do not reapply before the end date on your letter, you may no longer be eligible for help.**
