Executive Summary

Purpose: To control expenditures by preventing duplication of non-oral contraceptive products

Why Issue Selected:

Non-oral contraceptive agents include intrauterine devices (hormone-containing and copper-containing), transdermal patches, long-acting intramuscular injections, vaginal rings, and diaphragm devices. These options of birth control are largely safe and effective, with most products offering the patient the convenience of continuous contraception without requiring the use of a daily oral tablet. More than 10% of women who use birth control now chose a non-oral form. Because of the long-acting nature of these products, MO HealthNet has discovered the need to monitor utilization of these claims to prevent duplication of therapy from the various providers involved in the patient's care.
