MO HealthNet believes that helping people lead healthier lives can help reduce illness. That is why MO HealthNet is working with health care providers to become Health Homes. To avoid confusion, we want you to understand that a Health Home is NOT a place where you live. Instead, your Health Home gives you a Care Team of healthcare professionals, including a nurse care manager, to help you with your health needs and help you reach your wellness goals. Studies show that people with a Health Home get better care and healthier results.

What your Health Home can do for you:

- Help you with your health conditions, medicine, and medical treatments.
- Give you health information about smoking, healthy eating and exercise.
- Help you get any kind of special medical care you might need, including mental health and/or substance abuse treatment.

Your Health Home is «HCH_Provider_Name». They will be contacting you in the near future (if you have not already heard from them) to discuss and answer any questions. The services you get from your Health Home are free under your current MO HealthNet plan, so there is no charge to you, and participation in this program is voluntary. Having a health home does not change the copay for which you may be responsible for regular MO HealthNet services, such as doctor visits with your primary care physician. This will not affect your current MO HealthNet benefits or other MO HealthNet covered services you may receive.

If you have questions about this letter, you can call your Health Home shown above for information. If at any time you wish to change Health Home or stop getting Health Home services altogether, please contact your Health Home so they can assist you.
