

Public Notice Regarding Certified Community Behavioral Health Organization (CCBHO) Program Administered by the Department of Mental Health

May 12, 2022

Pursuant to Sections 1902(a)13(A) of the Social Security Act and 42 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) 447.205, which mandate that proposed changes in statewide methods and standards for setting Medicaid payment rates be published and made available for review and comment, this is to advise that:

1. The Missouri Department of Mental Health provides notice of the following:

To ensure efficiency, economy, quality of care, and access, a State Plan Amendment for Certified Community Behavioral Health Organizations (CCBHO) is being submitted to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services. This State Plan Amendment includes the following revisions:

- Updates the effective date for a trend increase and for the addition of new CCBHO providers; and
- Updates the Quality Incentive Payment language to a Value Based Payment and changes the amount of the payment from 1% to 3% of total payments made to the CCBHO for CCBH rehabilitative services in the performance period.

This State Plan will be submitted under State Plan Transmittal Number 22-0018 and be effective for dates of service beginning July 1, 2022.

Total annual fiscal impact is estimated to be approximately \$.3 million (\$.1 million state share and \$.2 million federal share) for MHD clinic services. There is no fiscal impact to the department as these services will be provided out of existing appropriation.
