Behavioral Pharmacy Management™ (BPM) Quarterly Reports (separate sets of reports are delivered for adults and children)

- **BPM Summary Spreadsheet** a detailed snapshop of pharmacy prescribing in Missouri, showing patient counts, provider counts, claim counts, total costs, and PUPM costs for the most recent quarter. These numbers are further broken down by drug class, as well as by Quality Indicator™ (QI)- a series of proprietary clinical algorithms that define instances of care that are potentially inappropriate and/or unnecessarily costly.
- **BPM Provider Detail Summary** a comprehensive list of all Missouri providers who have flagged one or more QIs in the most recent quarter, showing the specific QIs flagged and associated counts and costs for the prescriber's flagged vs. non-flagged patients.

Opioid Prescription Intervention™ (OPI) Bimonthly Reports

- *OPI Quality Indicator™ Summary* a comprehensive list of OPI QIs, with counts and percentages of patients and providers flagging each QI.
- OPI High-Risk Substance Abuse Patients the top 50 high-risk opioid patients, based on recent history
 of alcohol, opioid, or other substance abuse diagnoses, and use of multiple prescribers/pharmacies to fill
 opioid prescriptions.
- OPI Prescriber-Identified High-Risk Patients the top 50 patients for whom prescribers seem willing
 only to prescribe small doses of opioids, and yet who obtain large total daily doses through extreme
 drug-seeking behaviors, such as obtaining opioid medications in small doses from multiple different
 providers and/or pharmacies.
- **OPI High Volume Prescribers** a list of prescribers whose practice includes a large percentage of patients with substance abuse diagnoses who are prescribed opioids.
