Enrollment

- **Change in MOHealthNET Enrollment**
 - Total Enrollment, January 2018: **977,531**
 - Total Enrollment, January 2019: **904,679**
 - Total Enrollment, February 2019: **900,186**
 - **Drop of 77,345 since Jan 2018, -7.9%**
- **Over 60,000 of the enrollment drop is children**
 - (-60,681: about 79% of the drop, drop of -9.8%)
- **Lowest enrollment in MO HealthNET since February 2015**
 - 2015 was the last time enrollment in Missouri Medicaid dipped below 900,000
- **Discussion needs to focus on**
 - Causes, Consequences, Responses, Budget Implications
 - Only part of this likely due to economy
 - Unemployment rate dropped only from 3.8% to 3.2% in this period; but most of drop occurred from 2010 until 2018
 - Food stamp rolls dropped by smaller amount: -3.9% from January 2018 to February 2019
 - Children remain eligible fro CHIP even if parents income rises; data show most of drop in enrollment is for those with incomes less than 100% of the poverty line
