WHAT IS MMIS?







- Medicaid Management Information System - state mechanized claims processing and information retrieval systems
- The MMIS is owned by the State, but is operated by the Fiscal Agent
- Started development of current MMIS in 1979





MMIS Components

- Provider Enrollment
- Claims Processing Including Adjudication, Pricing and Payment
- Managed Care Encounter Data Processing
- Provider and Managed Care Health Plan Payments
- Federal Financial Reporting





MMIS Components

- Decision Support System and Data Warehouse
- Processing Prior Authorizations and Pre-Certifications for Services
- Claims and Encounter Data History
- eMOMED Web Portal Providers Use to Submit and View Claims and State Staff Use to Manage Claims





MMIS Components

- Over 96 million claims processed annually
- Payments in excess of \$6 billion
- Average claim processing time .58 days
- Over 99% of claims submitted electronically – POS 50%, eMomed 40%, Direct to Data Center 10%
- Over 240 million hits on eMomed
- Over 42,000 registered eMomed users
- Over 38,000 Medicaid providers

- POS available 24X7
- eMomed available 24X7
- MMIS Uptime over 99 percent
- POS response times less than 5 seconds

Fiscal Agent Functions

- MMIS Operation and Development
- Call Centers Participant, Provider, Pharmacy, Technical Help Desk
- Managed Care Enrollment Broker
- Third Party Liability Cost Avoidance
- Medicaid ID Cards
- Clinical Authorizations, Medical Policy/Exceptions





Fiscal Agent Functions

- Provider Manuals
- Physical and Network Security
- Data Center (Leonia, NJ)
- Project Management
- Mailroom, Data Entry

WHAT IS CMSP?







- Clinical Management Services and System for Pharmacy Claims and Prior Authorization
- Designed primarily to support clinical and pharmacy programs
- Part of Overall Missouri MMIS





CMSP Functions

- Clinical and Pharmacy Claims Adjudication
- Prior Authorizations and Pre-Certifications for Participant Services – Inpatient, Optical, DME, Radiology, and Psychology
- CyberAccess Web Portal Providers View Claims History and State Staff Use to Support Case Management



CMSP Functions

- Medication Therapy Management and Immunization Billing
- Home and Community Based Services Portal to Support Assessments and Care Planning







Operated by Xerox Heritage, LLC (formerly ACS Heritage, LLC)

- Office located in Jefferson City
- Providing services since 2003
- Current contract can be extended through June 30, 2017

MMIS PROCUREMENT





- MMIS Fiscal Agent and CMSP Contracts Expire June 30, 2017
- MMIS Procurement Required by State and Federal Law
- State Receives Enhanced Match (75/25) for MMIS Operations

MMIS Alternatives Analysis





MMIS Alternatives

- Continue with Existing System and Upgrade with Current Technologies
- Replace the Existing System
- Hybrid Approach Replace Portions of Existing System with Commercial Off-The-Shelf Solutions





- Have Selected Contractor to Perform MITA SS-A and Alternatives Analysis
- Waiting for Federal Approval for Award and Enhanced 90/10 Funding
- Planned Completion by End of 2013
- Contractor is Independent of MMIS Solution Providers



- Remaining Steps in Procurement:
 - **Strategy Determination**
 - **RFP Development and Release**
 - **Proposal Evaluation and Award**
 - Implementation





MMIS Replacements

- If We Elected to Replace, Based on MMIS Replacements in Other States:
 - Cost Varies \$50 Million to \$150 Million
 - Replacement Timelines Range 3 to 5 Years
 - High Risk of Overages and Failures if not Adequately Planned and Executed
