



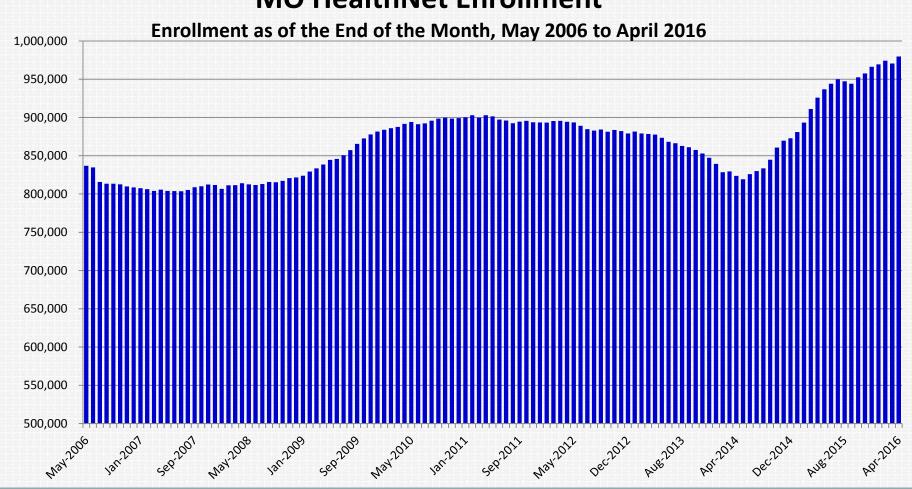

MO HealthNet Oversight Committee MHN Monthly Enrollment - Last 10 Years

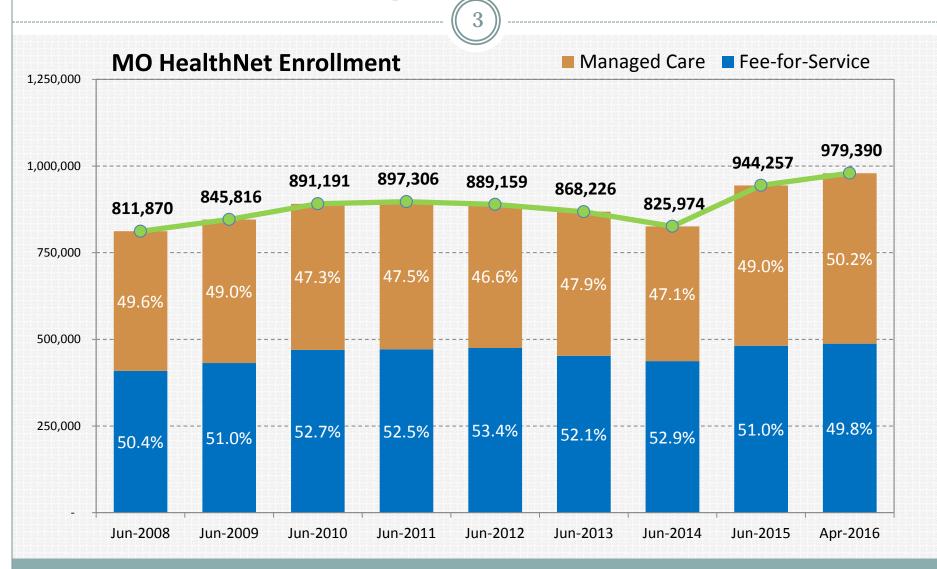


MO HealthNet Enrollment

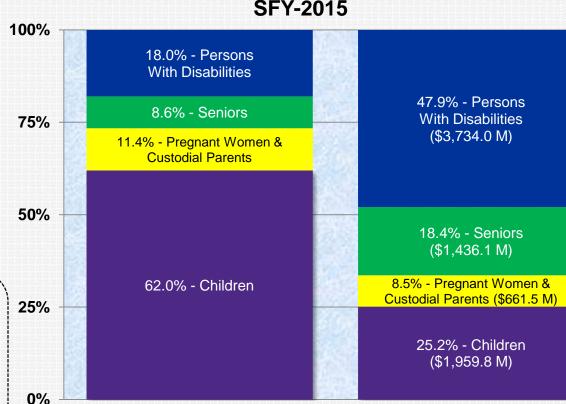

MHN Enrollees and Expenditures SFY-2015

In SFY-2015, seniors and persons with disabilities comprised nearly 27% of enrollees, however, they accounted for more than 66% of MO HealthNet expenditures.
