Well child exams are important to keep kids healthy. Exams can help catch health problems early when they are most treatable. With MO HealthNet coverage these visits are free.

What does a well child exam include?

- Comprehensive physical examination
- Review of health & developmental history including assessment of both physical & mental health
- Health education
- Appropriate immunizations according to age
- Laboratory tests as indicated
- Lead screening according to established guidelines
- Hearing screening
- Vision screening
- Dental screening

What does MO HealthNet cover for kids?

- Transportation to scheduled appointments
- Preventative care appointments
- Dental care
- Routine Check Ups
- Prescriptions
- Immunizations

Discrimination & Civil Rights

HHS provides federal financial assistance for many programs to enhance health and well-being, including TANF, Head Start, the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP), and others. If you believe that you have been discriminated against because of your race, color, national origin, disability, age, sex (including pregnancy, sexual orientation, and gender identity), or religion in programs or activities that HHS directly operates or to which HHS provides federal financial assistance, you may file a complaint with the Office for Civil Rights (OCR) for yourself or for someone else.

To file a complaint of discrimination for yourself or someone else regarding a program receiving federal financial assistance through HHS, complete the form on line through OCR's Complaint Portal at <https://ocrportal.hhs.gov/ocr/>. For faster processing, we encourage you to use the OCR online portal to file complaints rather than filing via mail. Persons who need assistance with filing a civil rights complaint can email OCR at OCRMail@hhs.gov or call OCR toll-free at **1-800-368-1019**, TDD 1-800-537-7697. For persons who are deaf, hard of hearing, or have speech difficulties, please dial 7-1-1 to access telecommunications relay services. We also provide alternative formats (such as Braille and large print), auxiliary aids and language assistance services free of charge for filing a complaint.

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
