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COVID-19 VACCINE-REVISED

APPLIES TO: Providers who administer the COVID-19 Vaccine

EFFECTIVE DATE: December 14, 2020 and February 27, 2021

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COVID-19 VACCINE

The MO HealthNet Division (MHD) is responding to an outbreak of respiratory disease caused by a novel coronavirus. The virus has been named “severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2” (“SARS-CoV-2”) and the disease it causes has been named “coronavirus disease 2019” (“COVID-19”).

COVID-19 VACCINE ADMINISTRATION PROCEDURE CODES

Effective for dates of service on or after December 14, 2020, providers may bill for the administration of the COVID-19 vaccine using the vaccine administration codes specific to the Moderna and Pfizer vaccines. **Effective for dates of service on or after February 27, 2021, providers may bill for the administration of the Janssen COVID-19 vaccine.** Do not bill vaccine administration procedure codes 90460-90461 or 90471-90474 for the administration of the COVID-19 vaccine.

If a significant separately identifiable Evaluation and Management (E/M) service is performed, the appropriate E/M service code should be reported in addition to the vaccine administration code. The vaccine ingredient cost *cannot* be billed to MO HealthNet.

Providers must not charge a copay for the COVID-19 vaccine administration codes.

Covered procedure codes are listed in the table below.

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OUTPATIENT BILLING FOR COVID-19 VACCINE ADMINISTRATION

Effective for dates of service on or after December 14, 2020, hospitals may bill for the COVID-19 vaccine administration when performed as an outpatient service using revenue code 771 and the appropriate procedure codes listed above. The above procedure codes cover the equipment and personnel needed to provide COVID-19 Vaccine Administration in the outpatient setting. If the above services are the only services provided during the outpatient visit, without any medical professional services, a facility charge must not be billed.

PHARMACY COVID-19 VACCINE ADMINISTRATION

Effective for dates of service on or after December 14, 2020, pharmacy providers may bill for the COVID-19 vaccine through the point-of-sale pharmacy system using the National Drug Code (NDC) that appears on the product administered. Since we anticipate that initially, providers will not incur a cost for the product, providers should submit a \$0 charge amount for the ingredient cost.

Effective for Dates of Service through 3/14/2021:

Each pharmacy claim will receive a professional dispensing fee of \$22.67 for single-dose and multi-dose vaccines. \$22.67 is a blended rate of the two Medicare rates prior to 3/15/2021. The professional dispensing fee will serve as reimbursement for the administration of the COVID-19 vaccine. For multi-dose COVID-19 vaccines, both the first and second dose will receive the \$22.67 professional dispensing fee. Providers must not charge a copay for the COVID-19 vaccine.

Effective for Dates of Service on and after 3/15/2021:

Each pharmacy claim will receive a professional dispensing fee of \$40.00 for single-dose and multi-dose vaccines. The professional dispensing fee will serve as reimbursement for the administration of the COVID-19 vaccine. Providers must not charge a copay for the COVID-19 vaccine.

COVID-19 vaccination pharmacy claims, ordered by pharmacists, should be submitted using the pharmacist’s name and pharmacy’s National Provider Identifier (NPI), as prescriber. Pharmacies are also able to utilize the statewide standing order for COVID Vaccines.

Pharmacy providers administering COVID-19 vaccinations should instruct members receiving vaccines that require two doses to do the following:

- Use the same pharmacy for both vaccinations.
- Receive the second dose on the date specified by the manufacturer’s product labeling.

MEDICARE/MEDICAID CLAIMS

COVID-19 vaccination claims for MHD participants who are dually eligible for both Medicare and Medicaid must be billed to the member’s Medicare plan provider.

MANAGED CARE ENROLLEES

Under the current Managed Care program, the administration of a vaccine is billed to the provider's contracted Managed Care Organization (MCO). For the purpose of the COVID-19 vaccine only, the administration portion of the vaccine must be billed to the MO HealthNet Fee-for-Service program, and not to the Managed Care Organization with which the provider is contracted.

REIMBURSEMENT FOR THE UNINSURED

The COVID-19 Claims Reimbursement to Health Care Providers and Facilities for Testing and Treatment of the Uninsured Program (COVID-19 Claims Reimbursement program) administered by the Health Resources & Services Administration (HRSA) is available for reimbursement of a COVID-19 vaccine and vaccine administration costs for individuals who would not receive MO HealthNet coverage for the COVID-19 vaccine administration, see <https://www.hrsa.gov/CovidUninsuredClaim>.
