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## JUVENILE COURT OVERVIEW

This report is the fifty-eighth in a series of juvenile court statistics, and the twenty-fourth published under the direction of the Division of Youth Services (DYS) and the Department of Social Services' Research and Evaluation Unit, as mandated by Section 219.036.4, RSMo. This report presents the summary statistics of Missouri's juvenile court system for calendar year 2002.

The numbers presented in this report are not individual children, but separately disposed court referrals. A referral is defined as "any action involving a juvenile which results in a determination, finding, or outcome and a written record maintained in the juvenile's name." A disposed referral is one which has resulted in a "finding" or "outcome."

Examples of findings and outcomes include the following: Court Adjudication, Informal Adjustment, Transfer to Other Court, and Rejection of Referral.

Throughout this report, the term "referral" means "disposed referral."

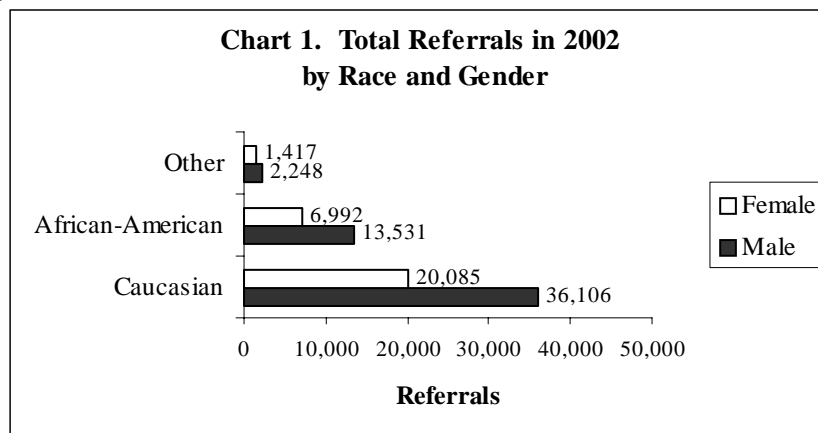
In calendar year 2002, Missouri's 45 juvenile courts disposed 80,381 referrals. This is a nine percent decrease from the high point of 88,424 in 1999 and an eight percent decrease from 2001 alone.

NOTE: The number of children represented by these referrals can not be accurately reported due to inconsistencies in identification systems from circuit to circuit. Therefore, an unduplicated statewide count of individual children is not available.

## Race and Gender Comparisons

Chart 1 shows the gender and racial breakdown of all referrals in 2002. Males made up the larger portion in each racial grouping. Overall, males made up 65 percent of all referrals, while females made up 35 percent. Caucasian youth comprised 70 percent of the referral population, African-American youth comprised 26 percent, and four percent of referrals were of other races.



## Referral Types

Referrals to Missouri's juvenile courts break down into five categories:

<b>Law Violations:</b>	Acts which would be in violation of the Missouri Criminal Code if they were committed by an adult.
<b>Status Violations:</b>	Acts which are violations only if committed by a juvenile. These include such infractions as truancy and running away from home.
<b>Abuse, Neglect, Custody: (A/N/C)</b>	Reports of Missouri children who were victims of abuse or neglect, and children involved in custody disputes, transfers, or terminations of parental rights.
<b>Court Order Violations:</b>	Reported referrals of violations of court orders.
<b>Municipal, Juvenile:</b>	Referrals for juvenile municipal violations, such as smoking in a public place and curfew violations. Prior to 2001, these referrals were reported in the Status and Administrative categories.

Table 2 shows the breakdown of all referrals into the appropriate referral categories over the past ten years. As in the past, the Law Violation category contained the most referrals, at 53 percent.

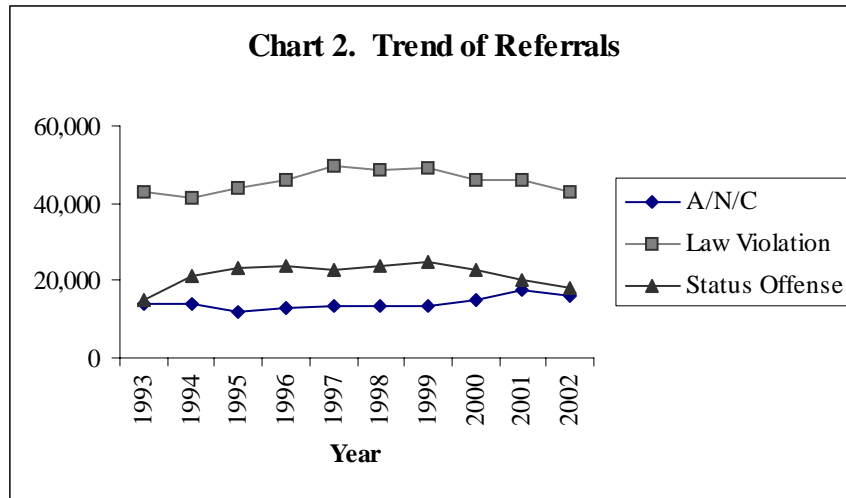
\*\* The *Municipal, Juvenile* category is effective with 2001 reporting. See above definition.

## Referral Trends

Chart 2 illustrates the change in total referrals, by category, over the past ten years.

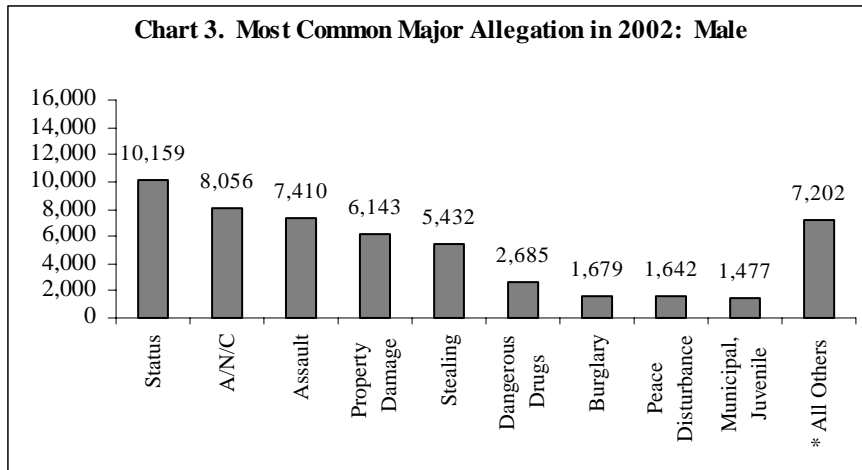


## Referral Sources

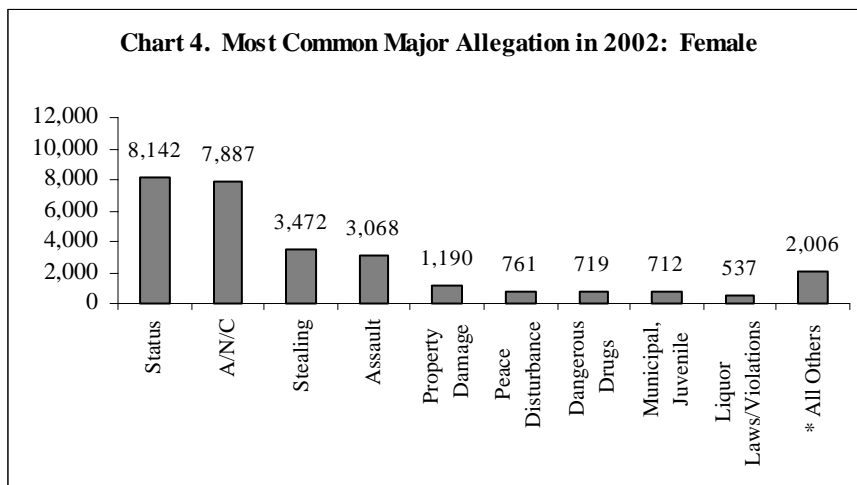
Referrals to the Missouri juvenile court system can come from many sources. In 2002, 59 percent of all referrals were initiated by law enforcement. As in the past, more than half of the abuse, neglect and custody referrals were initiated by the Department of Social Services' Division of Family Services (DFS). Status offense referrals were more likely to be made by schools or municipal police. The juvenile courts and parents were also the initiators of large numbers of referrals. Table 3 shows the sources of all referrals to the Missouri juvenile courts.

## Most Common Major Allegations



Charts 3 and 4 illustrate the most common major allegations, by gender, for referrals in 2002. Although status violation has the largest number of referrals, males are more likely to be referred for law violations than any other type of referral. Assault, stealing, and property damage are in the top five reasons for referral.



For females, the most referrals in 2002 were in the status offense category. However, there were many abuse, neglect and custody referrals as well. The number of female referrals for law violations of any kind is much lower both as a percentage of total female referrals and as compared to male referrals.

\* The top nine referral reasons for each gender are listed. "All Others" totals the remaining reasons for referral.

Note: Gender is undetermined for two referrals in 2002.

## Disposition of Referrals

After a youth has been referred to a juvenile court, a formal judgment or informal decision is made about how to handle the case. The possible determinations or outcomes fall into two categories: (1) those that are handled **formally** with a petition to the court, and (2) those that are **informally** adjusted outside of the court.

The **formal** dispositions are:

<b>True, Out-of-Home:</b>	The allegation is found to be true and the youth is placed out of his or her home. The placement may be with the Division of Youth Services, a foster home, a relative, or some other agency.
<b>True, In-Home:</b>	The allegation is found to be true and the youth receives services in his or her own home.
<b>True, No Services:</b>	The allegation is found to be true, but the youth receives no services.
<b>Not True:</b>	The allegation is found to be not true.
<b>Motion to Dismiss:</b>	The court sustains a motion to dismiss and the case is closed.
<b>Dismiss for Certification:</b>	The court sustains a motion to dismiss and the case is transferred to an adult criminal court to be processed under the criminal code.

The **informal** dispositions are:

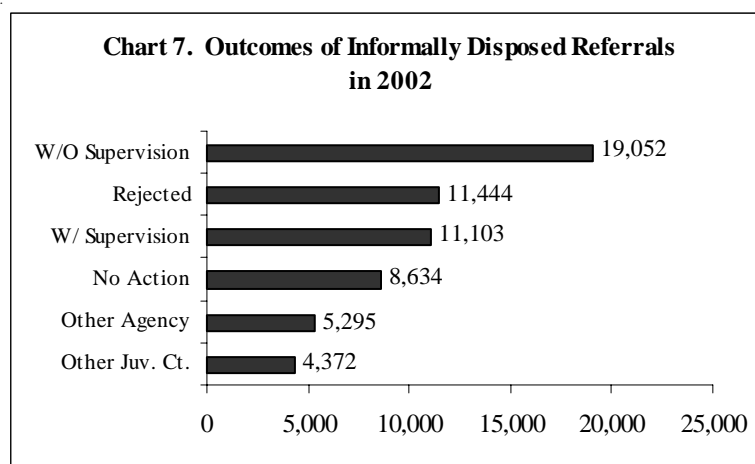
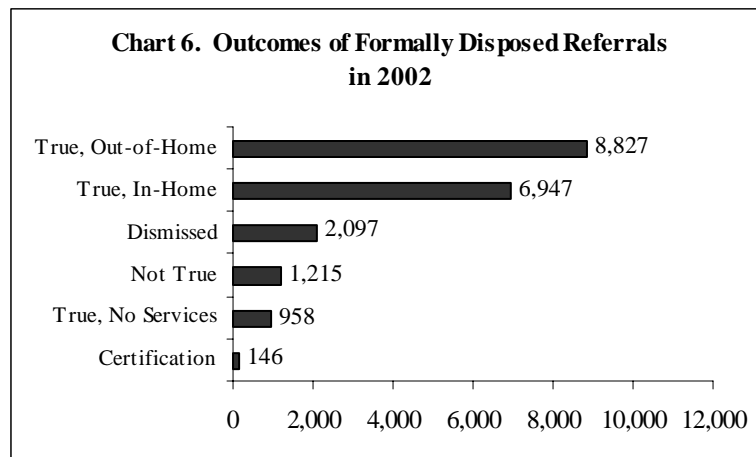
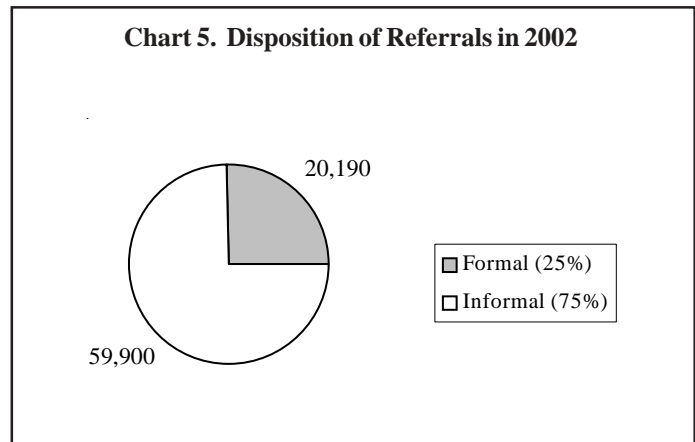
<b>Adjust without Supervision:</b>	No more than one face-to-face contact is made between court personnel and the juvenile. This usually results in the giving of advice, counsel or a verbal warning.
<b>Adjust with Supervision:</b>	Either a verbal or written agreement is made to put the juvenile under court supervision. This usually includes some sort of restitution or community service.
<b>Adjust - No Action:</b>	No action is taken by the juvenile officer other than the collection of information.
<b>Transfer to Other Juvenile Court:</b>	Jurisdiction over the juvenile is transferred to another juvenile court for disposition.
<b>Transfer to Other Agency:</b>	The youth's case record is turned over to another agency for disposition.
<b>Referral Rejected:</b>	No reason is found to sustain the referral.

## Disposition of Referrals (cont.)

The dispositions of referrals to Missouri juvenile courts are shown in Chart 5. In 2002, three-quarters (75%) of all referrals were informally disposed.

Charts 6 and 7 show the outcomes of formally and informally disposed referrals. Without supervision, in the informal category, was the finding for the largest number of referrals.

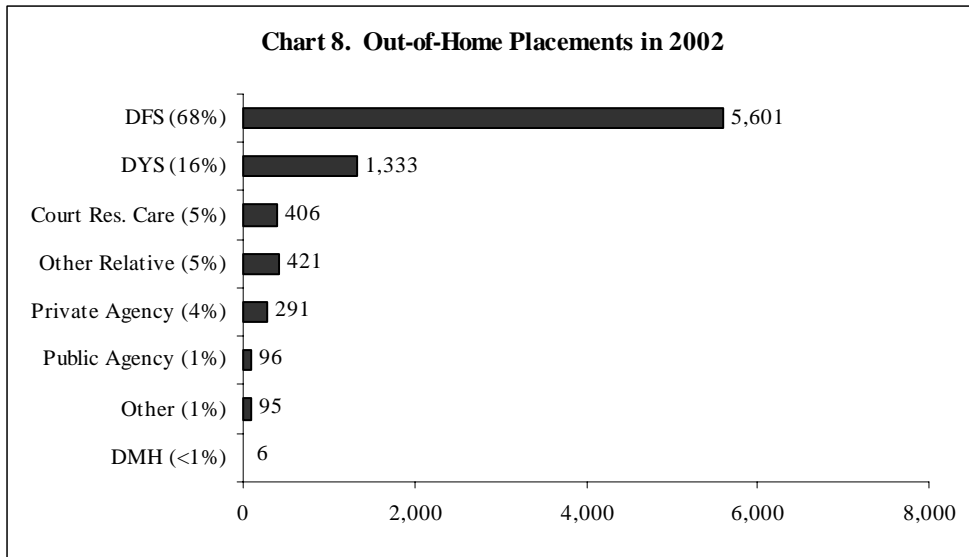
Formal dispositions accounted for 25 percent of all referral outcomes. Percentages for formal and informal referrals remain the same as in 2001.



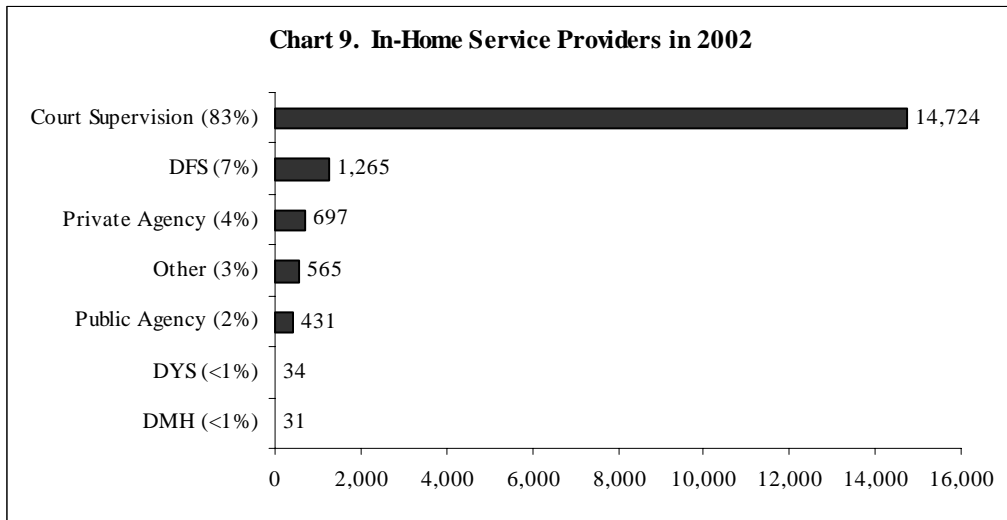
### Disposition of Referrals (cont.)

A total of 8,827 referrals were placed out-of-home in 2002. However, the location of the placement is unknown for 578 referrals. Of the 8,249 identified placement locations, 68 percent were made to DFS. Another 16 percent of these placements were made to DYS. Other placement categories include: court residential care, relatives other than parents, private agencies, or public agencies.

Chart 8 shows the distribution of out-of-home placements.



In-home services can be ordered by the court or provided informally by court personnel. In-home services were provided for 17,747 referrals in 2002 (formal and informal). Eighty-three percent of in-home service cases were supervised by juvenile court personnel. (Chart 9.)



## Certifications to Adult Court

In 2002, there were 146 referrals dismissed from the juvenile courts to allow certification to adult court. Table 4 shows the number of dismissed referrals by age and race.

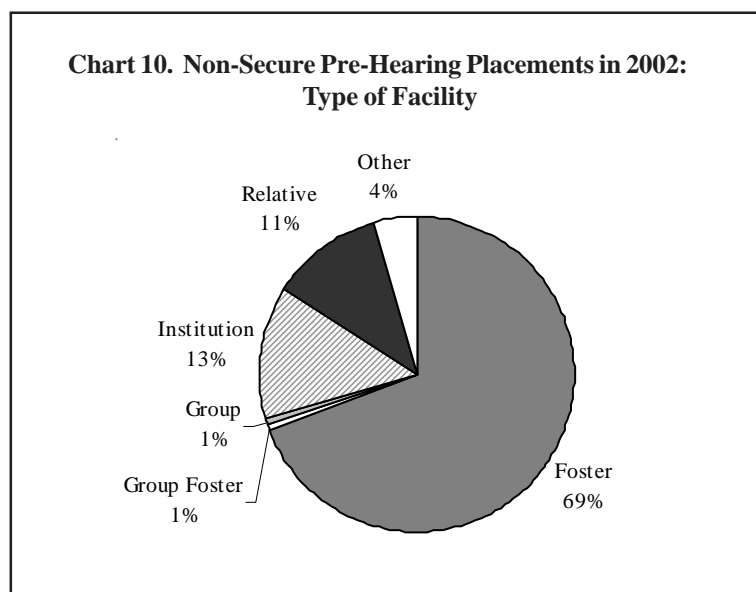

## Pre-Hearing Placements

At the time of a referral, a juvenile may be detained awaiting a determination. Two types of facilities are used for detention: secure and non-secure. During 2002, 11,636 referrals were detained prior to hearing. Males comprised 65 percent of all placements, and they were more likely to be detained in secure facilities. A breakdown of all detainees by category and gender is provided below in Table 5.

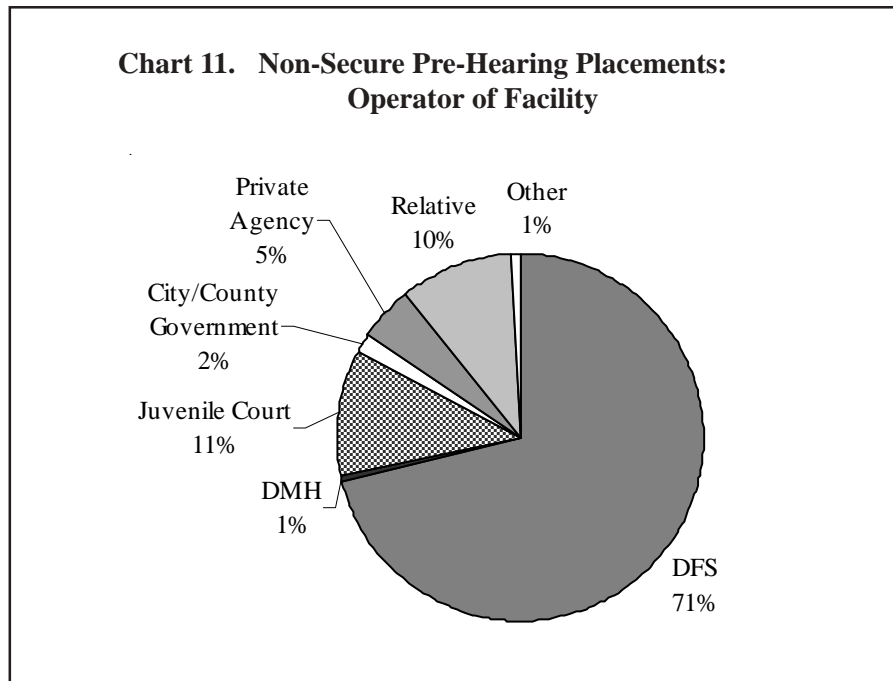

There are several types of facilities in which non-secure placements may be made: Foster Home, Group Home, Institution or Facility, Relative, and Other. In 2002, as in past years, the largest portion of these placements was made to the foster home category. Chart 10 details the percentage of placements into the different categories.



### Pre-Hearing Placements (cont.)

Chart 11 shows the operators of the non-secure facilities. The operators of a facility can be: DFS, the Department of Mental Health (DMH), Juvenile Court, City or County Government, Private Agency, Relative, or Other. DFS was the operator of the facilities in 71 percent of the disposed referrals that had a non-secure placement.

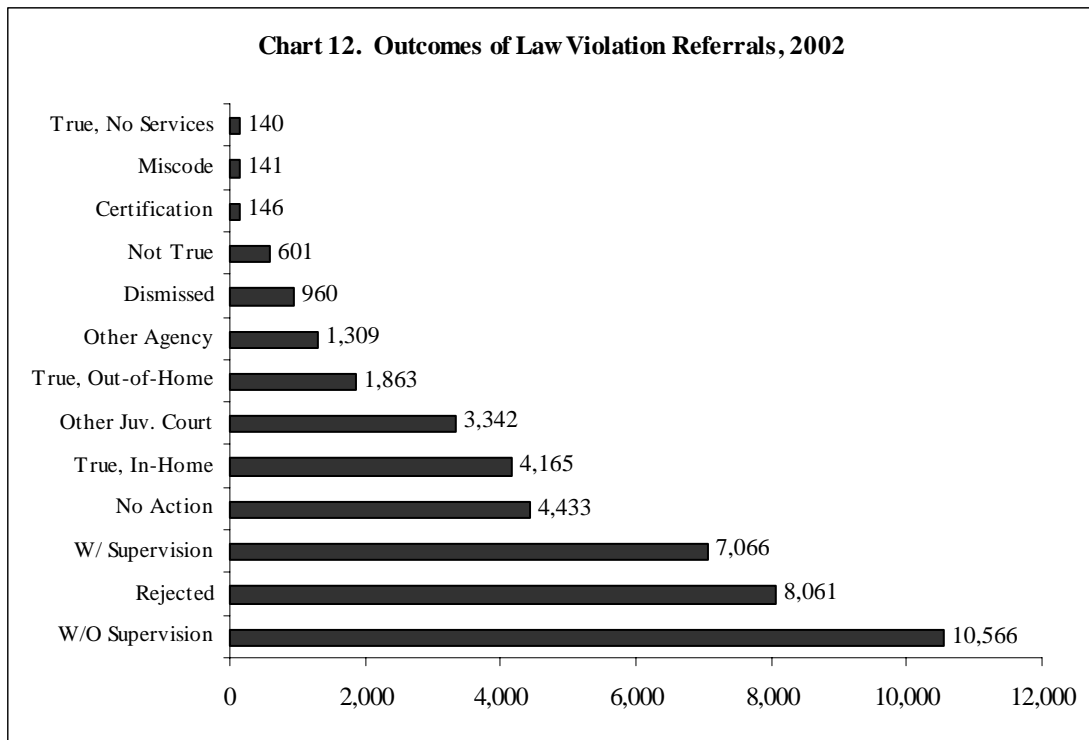


## LAW VIOLATION REFERRALS

Law violation referrals (42,793) made up 53 percent of all referrals to the juvenile court system in 2002. A law violation represents a single delinquent act, even though several offenses may have been committed at the same time by the child referred. The most serious violation that resulted in a final disposition is recorded as the major allegation for the referral.

### Law Violation Outcomes

Chart 12 depicts the outcomes of all law referrals. Informal adjustment without supervision accounted for 25 percent of all law violation outcomes. Informal adjustments accounted for 81 percent of law violation referrals.

### Prior Violations

The average number of prior law violations per referral varies greatly among different violations. Referrals for Fraud, Obstructing the Judicial Process, Robbery, and Flight/Escape are shown to have some of the highest incidences of prior allegations. (Table 6.)



## Age Distribution of Law Violators

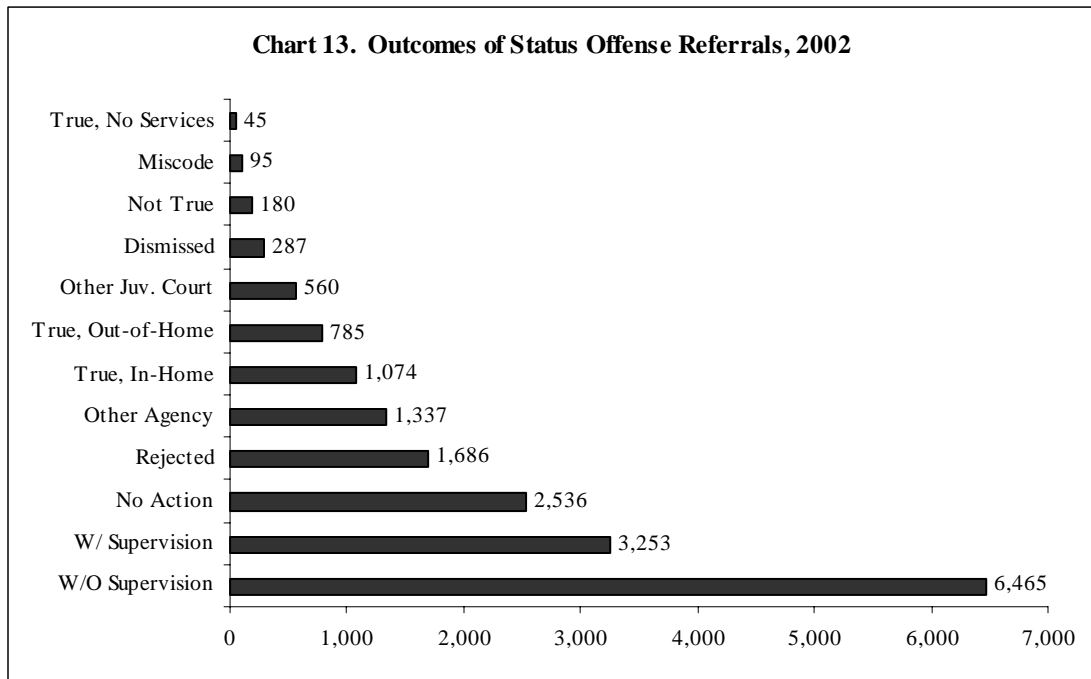
Forty-nine percent of all the law violation referrals in 2002 were 15- and 16-year-old youths. This age group was most likely to be referred for assault, stealing, property damage, or dangerous drugs. This same pattern can be seen among each of the age groups.

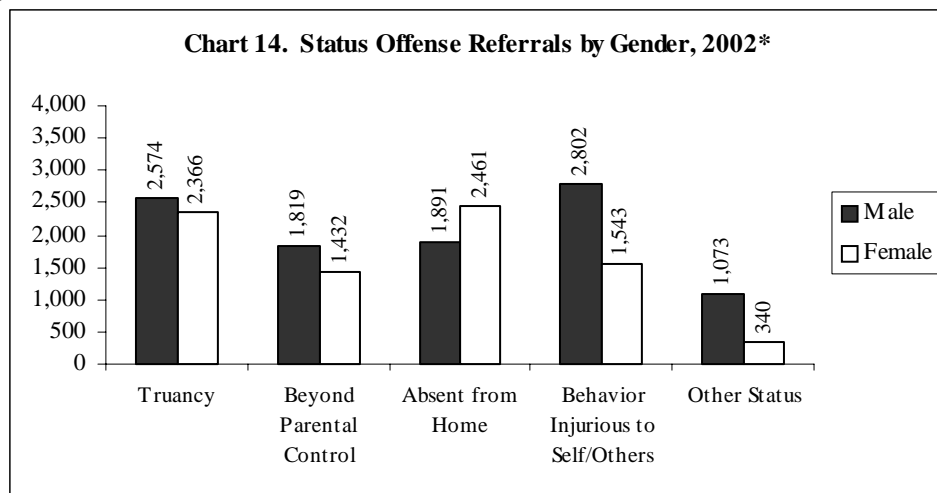
## STATUS OFFENSE REFERRALS

### Status Offense Outcomes

As in past years, most status offense referrals during 2002 were handled informally. See Chart 13 for a breakdown of numbers in the various referral categories.



Status offenses are those offenses that are not considered violations if committed by adults. In 2002, status offenses accounted for 23 percent of all referrals. The category with the largest number of referrals was “Truancy,” which had 4,940. “Absent from Home” was the only category in which the number of female referrals outnumbered the male referrals. (Chart 14.)



\* Note: Gender is undetermined for two Status Offense referrals in 2002.

## Status Offense Placements

Pre-hearing placements for status referrals are somewhat rare. Only nine percent of 2002 status referrals were detained prior to hearing. Of those juveniles held, 1,039 (64%) were held in secure facilities, 503 (31%) were held in non-secure facilities, and 94 (6%) were held in both secure and non-secure facilities pending their hearings. Runaways were more likely than other status offenders to be held in a secure setting. (Table 8.)

In 2002, 923 juveniles who were referred for status offenses were placed out-of-home: 38 percent were placed in the care of DFS; 21 percent were placed in the care of DYS; 14 percent were placed into juvenile court residential care; 10 percent were placed with private agencies; eight percent received supervised probation. The rest were placed elsewhere, including DMH, public agencies, or with relatives. (Table 9.)

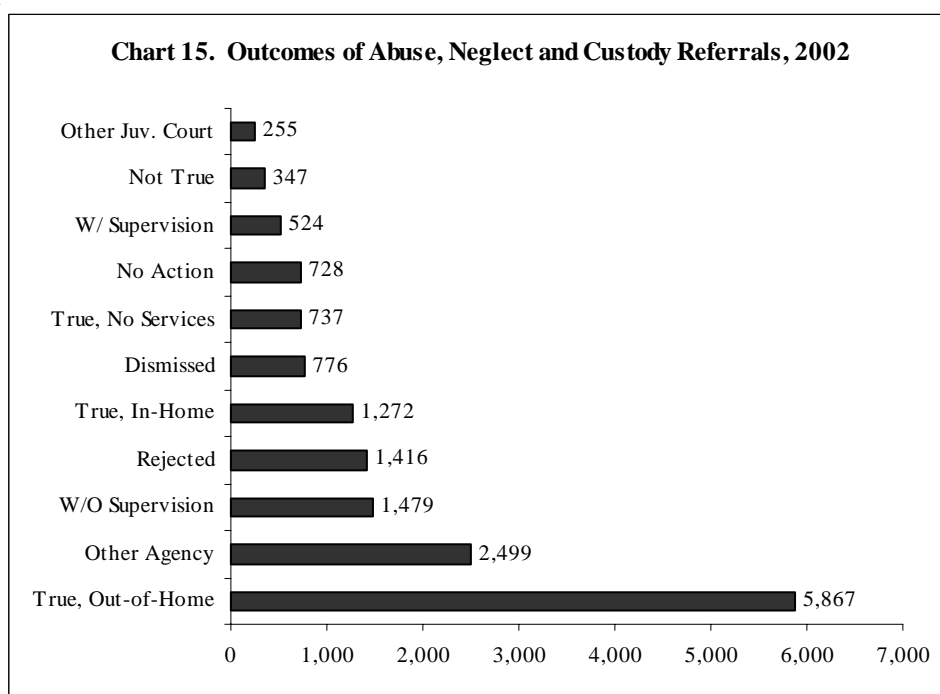
## ABUSE, NEGLECT AND CUSTODY REFERRALS

The abuse, neglect and custody category encompasses a wide range of referral types. Children can be referred because of physical abuse, abandonment, neglect, or because they are involved in custody disputes. A breakdown of all the abuse, neglect and custody referrals is listed in Table 10.

### Abuse, Neglect and Custody Outcomes

For Abuse, Neglect and Custody referrals, “True, Out-of-Home” was the most-frequently reported outcome category. Chart 15 shows the distribution of outcomes.

### Age Distribution of Abuse, Neglect and Custody Referrals
