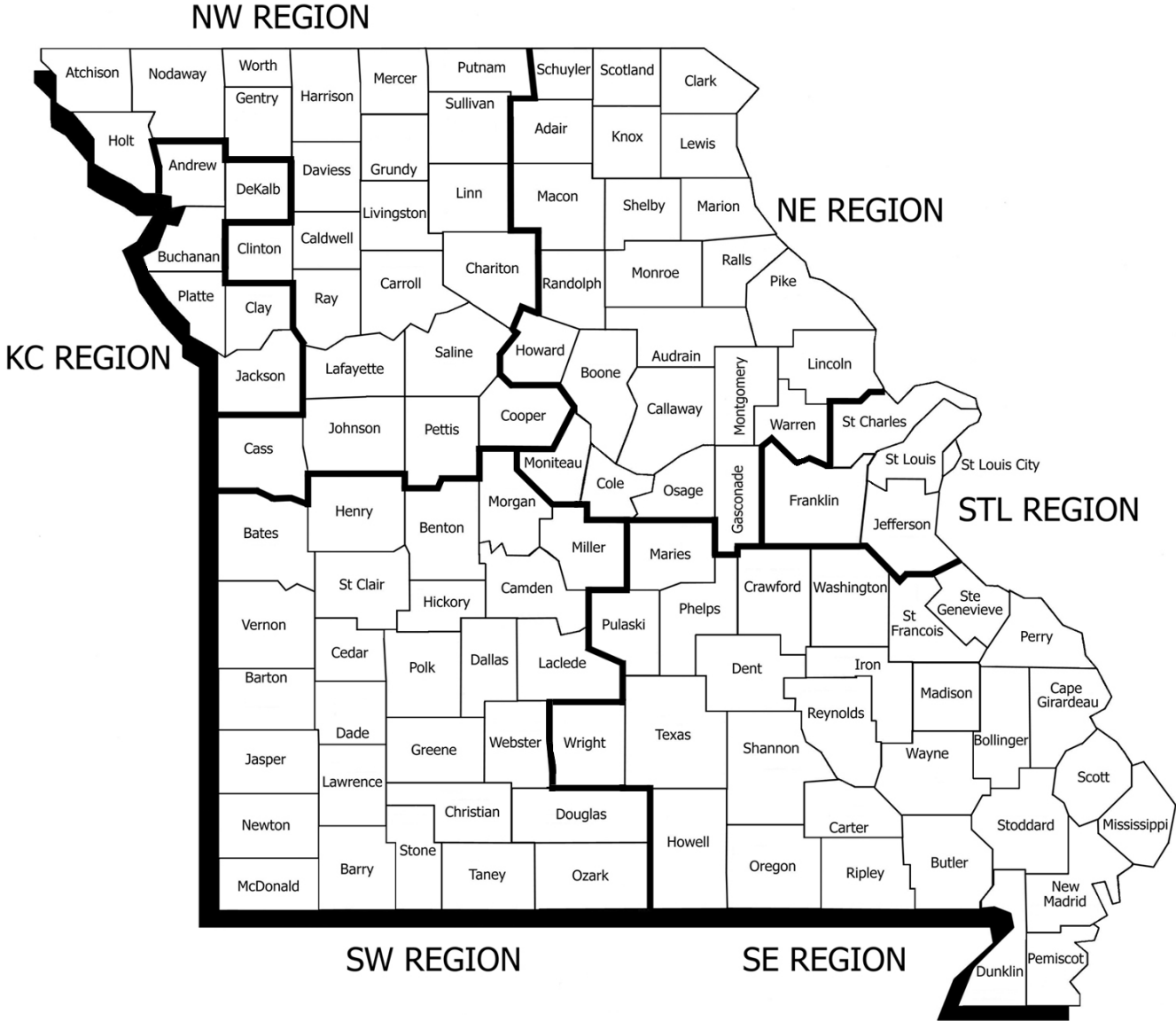

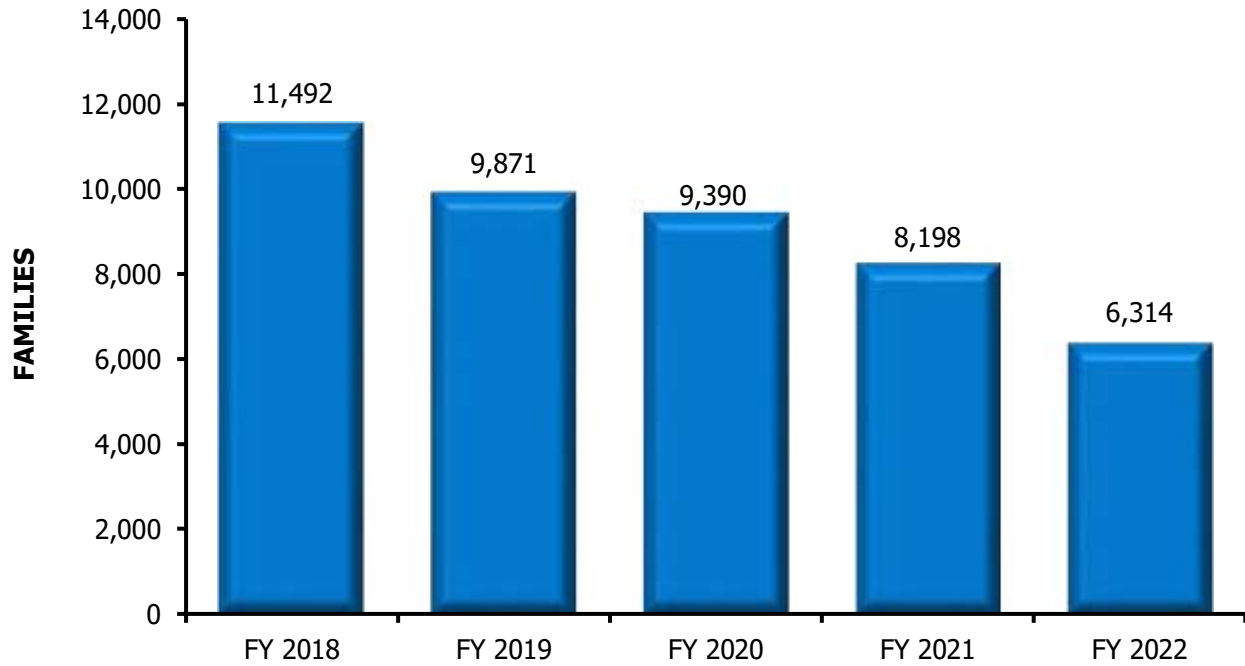

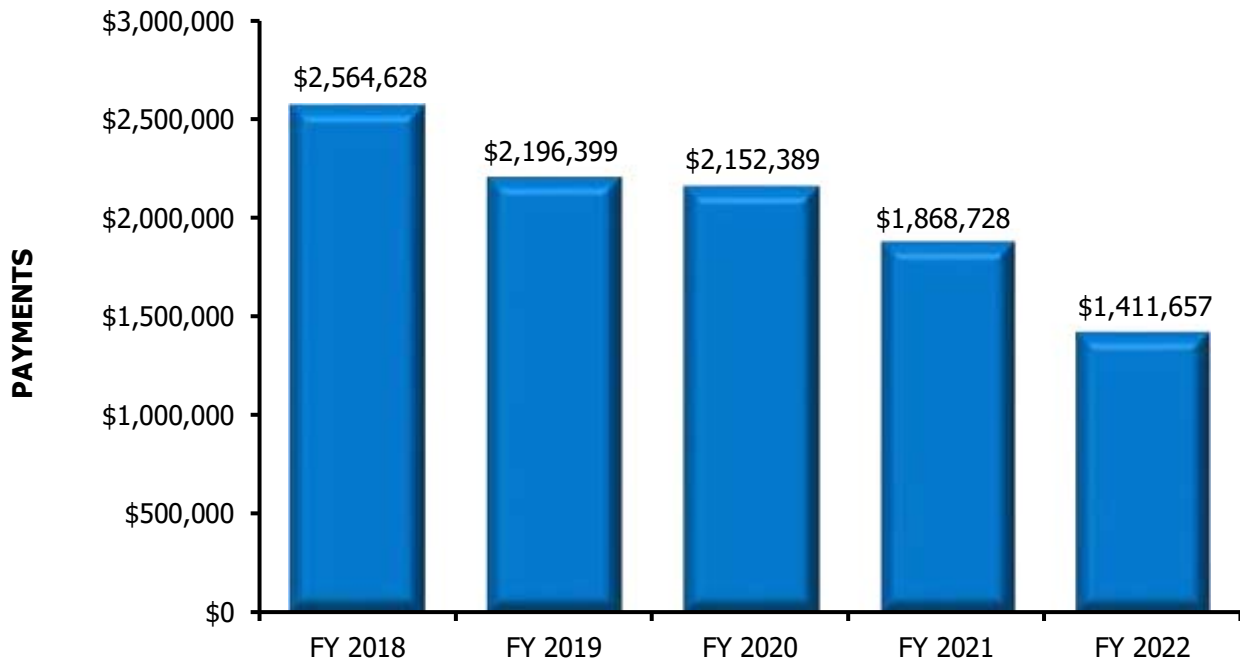

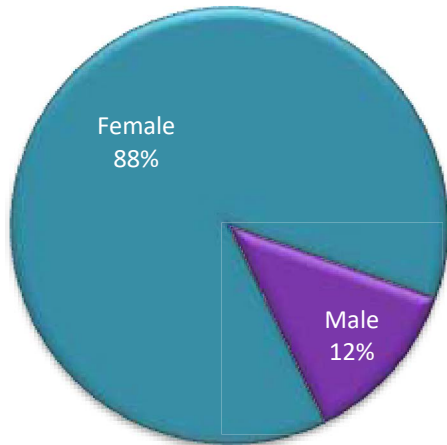

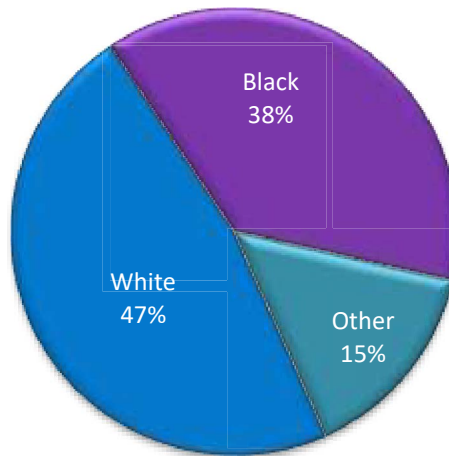

Figure 4. Representative Missouri Temporary Assistance Characteristics June 2022

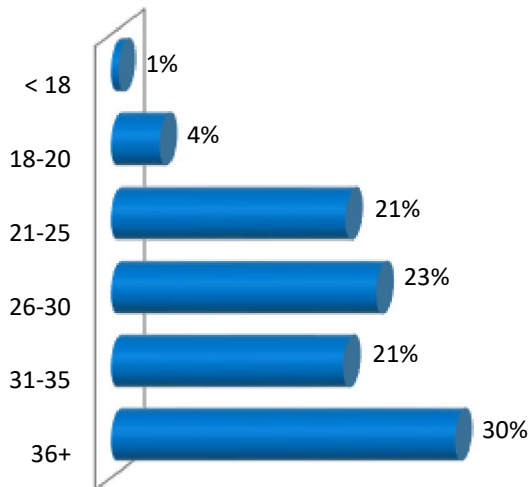
Gender of TANF Parent(s)/Caretaker(s)



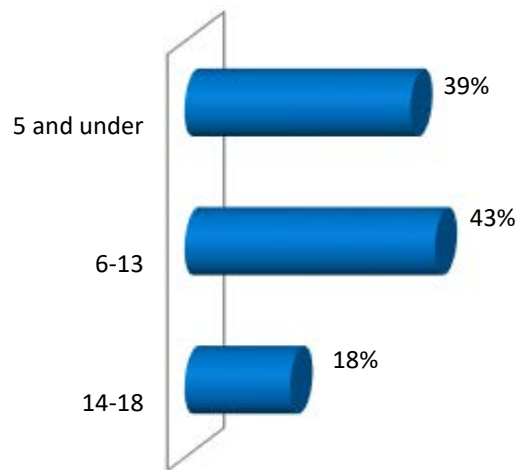
Race of TANF Participants



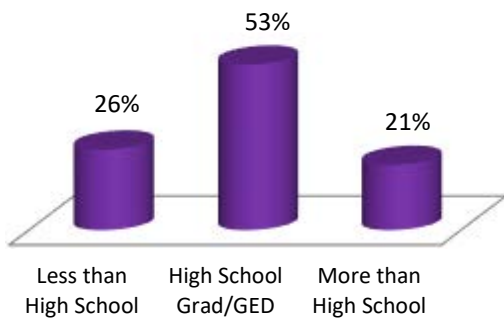

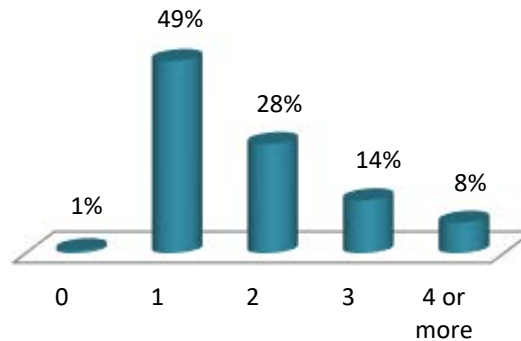
Age of TANF Children

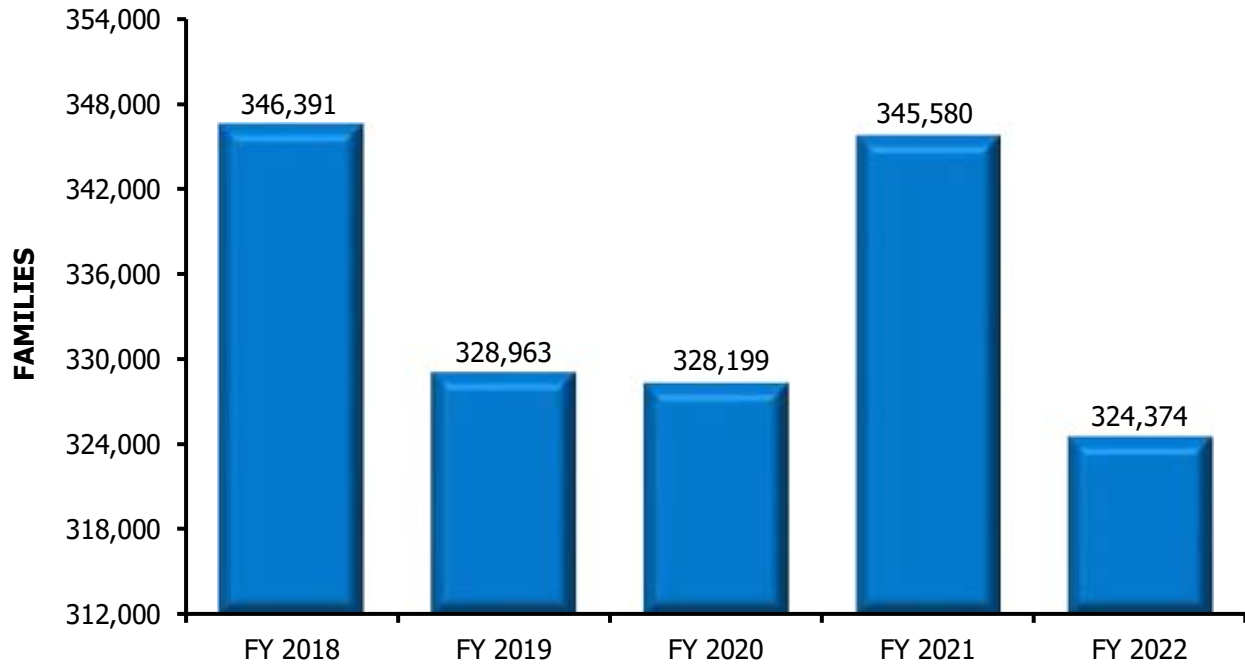

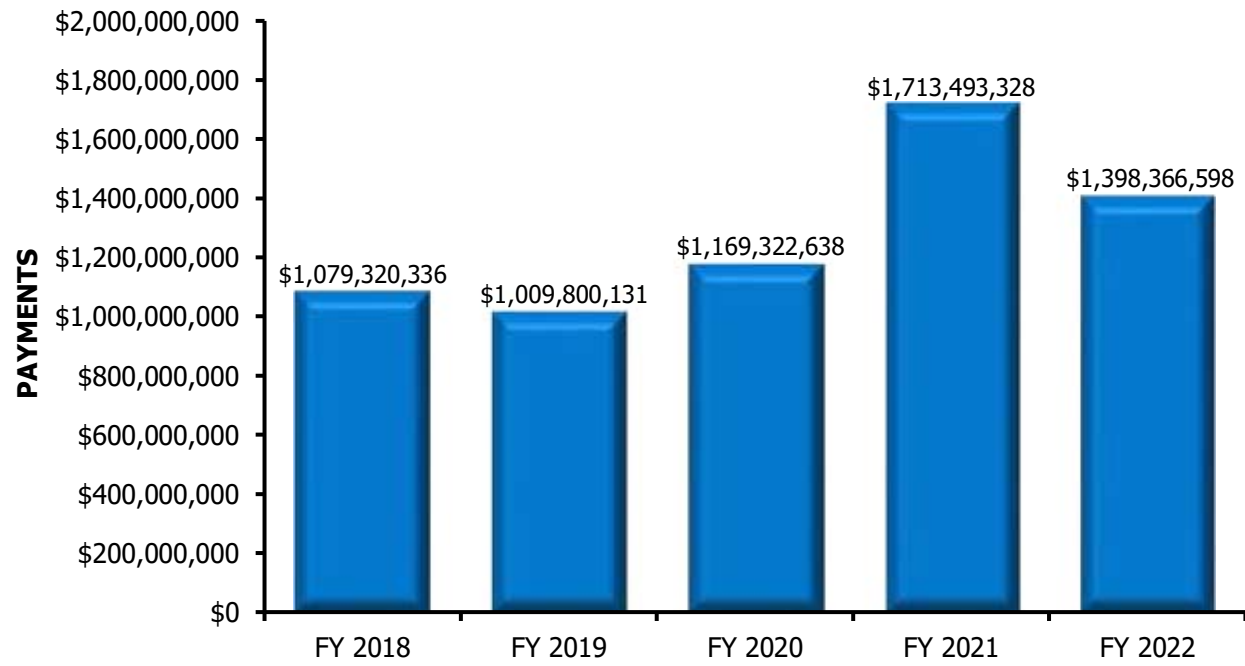

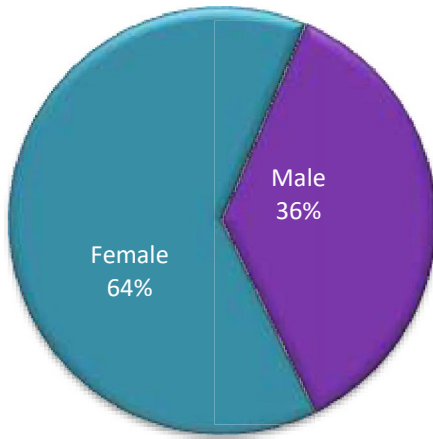

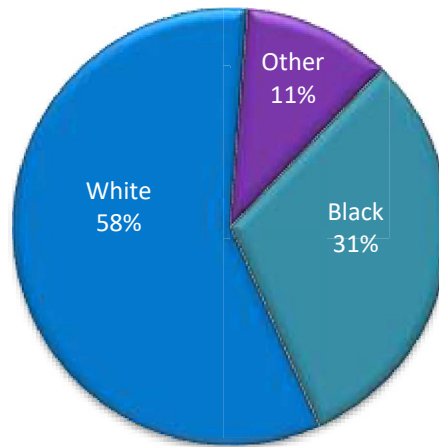

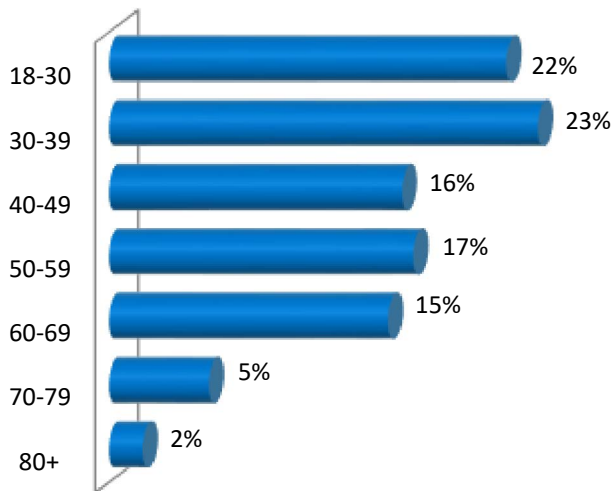
Gender of Adults Receiving Benefits



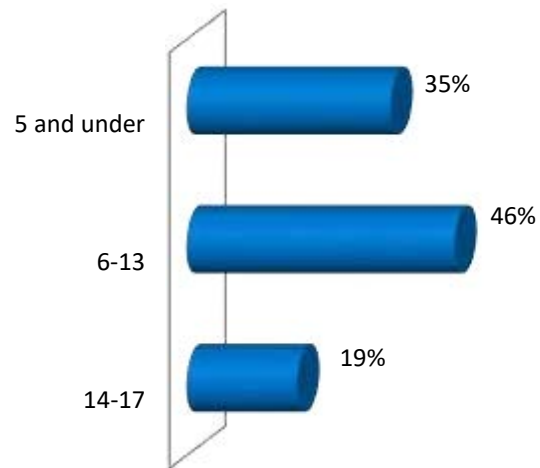
Race of Individuals Receiving Benefits



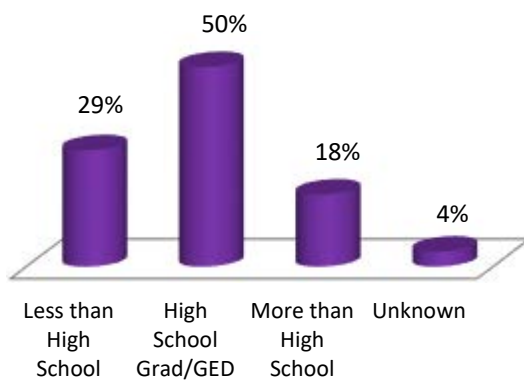
Age of Adults Receiving Benefits

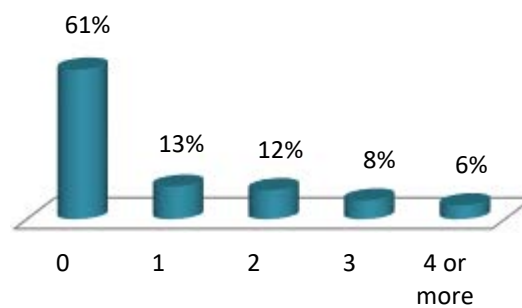
Age of Children Receiving Benefits
