Average Monthly Caseload Fiscal Years 2020 - 2024

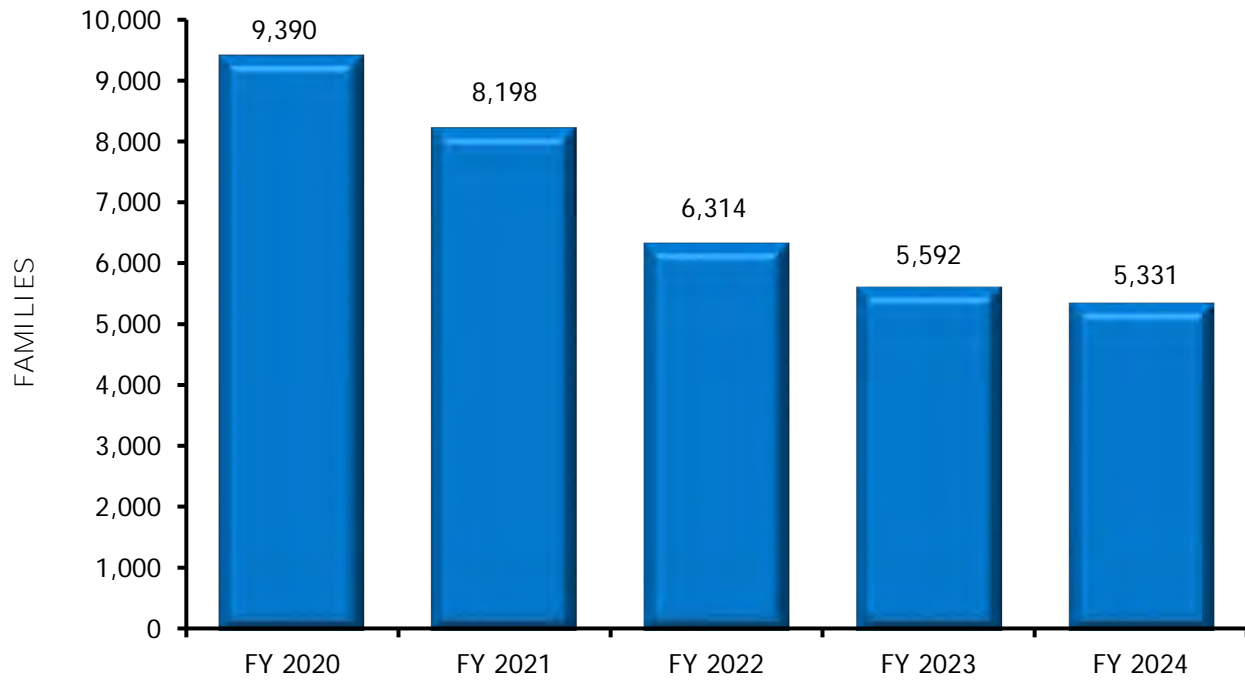


Figure 3. Temporary Assistance
Average Monthly Payments Fiscal Years 2020 - 2024

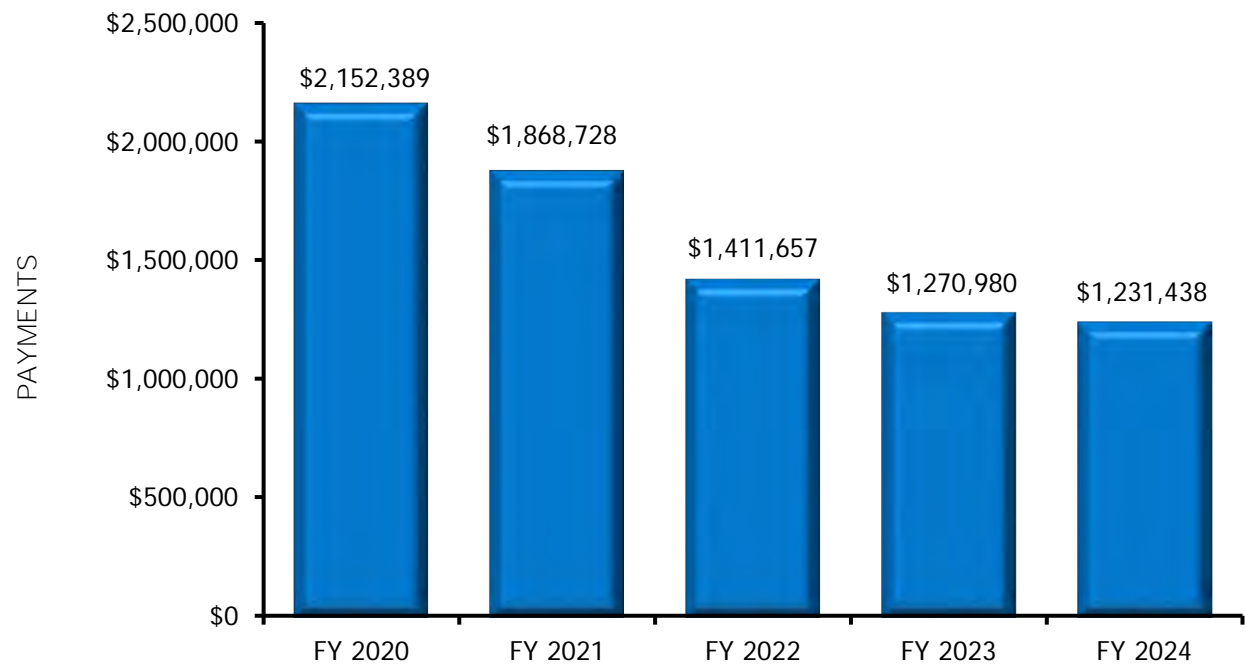

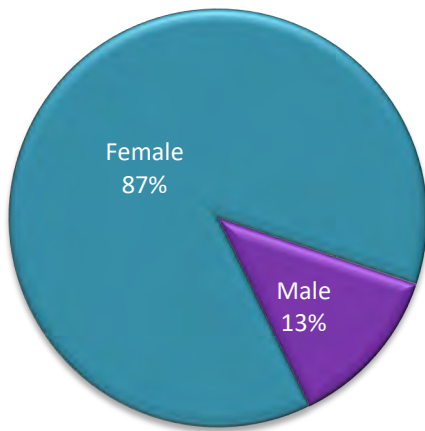

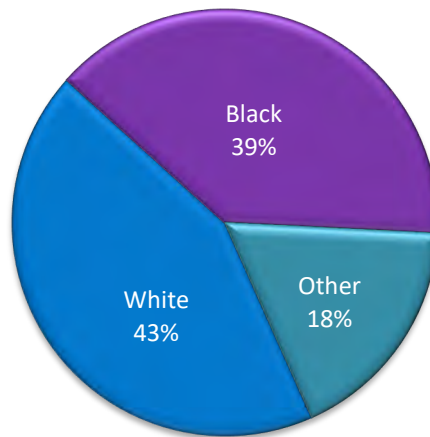

Gender of TANF Parent(s)/Caretaker(s)

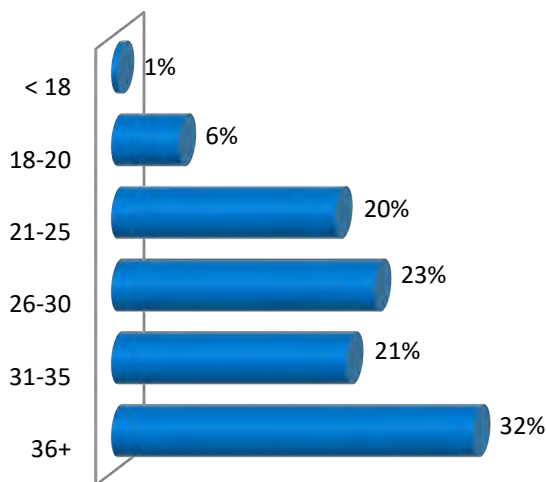


Race of TANF Participants



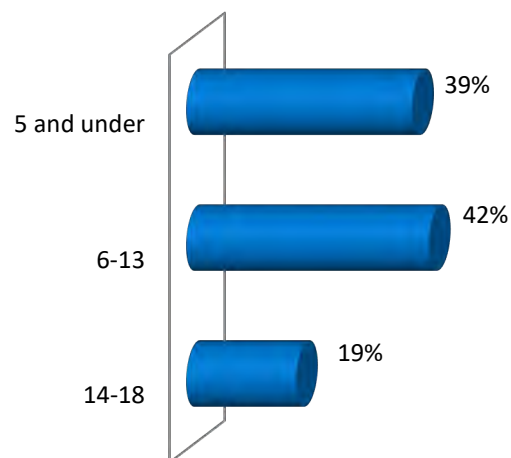

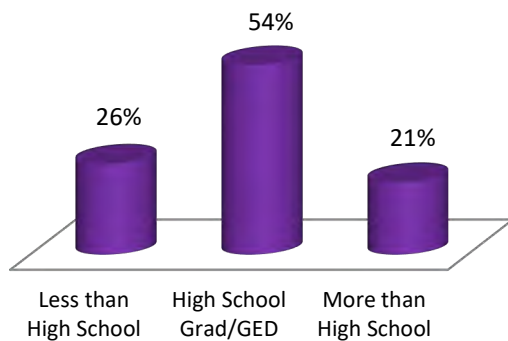


Age of TANF Children

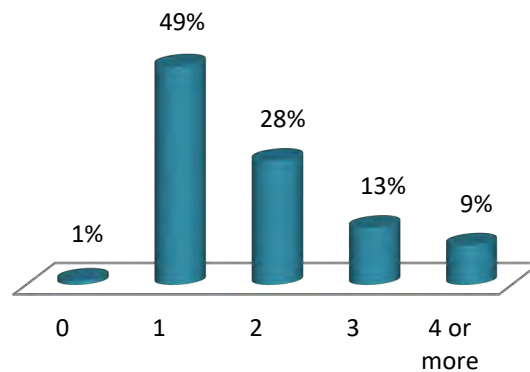

Average Monthly Caseload Fiscal Years 2020 - 2024

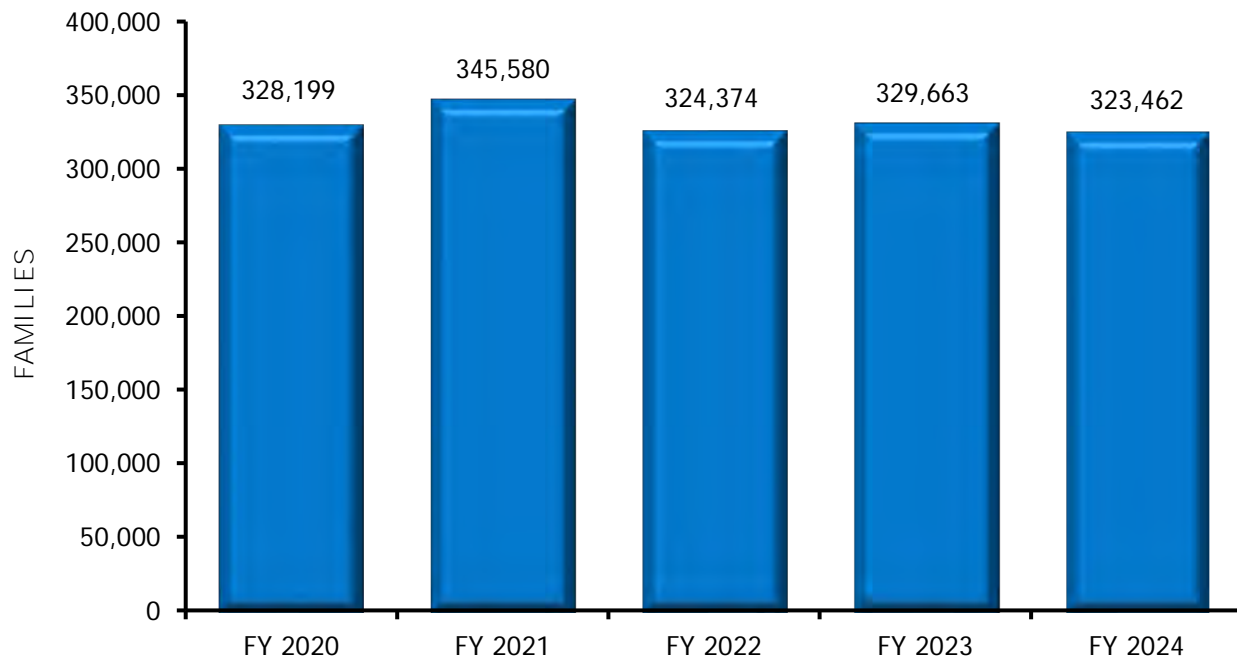


Figure 6. Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program
Annual Benefits Issued Fiscal Years 2020 - 2024

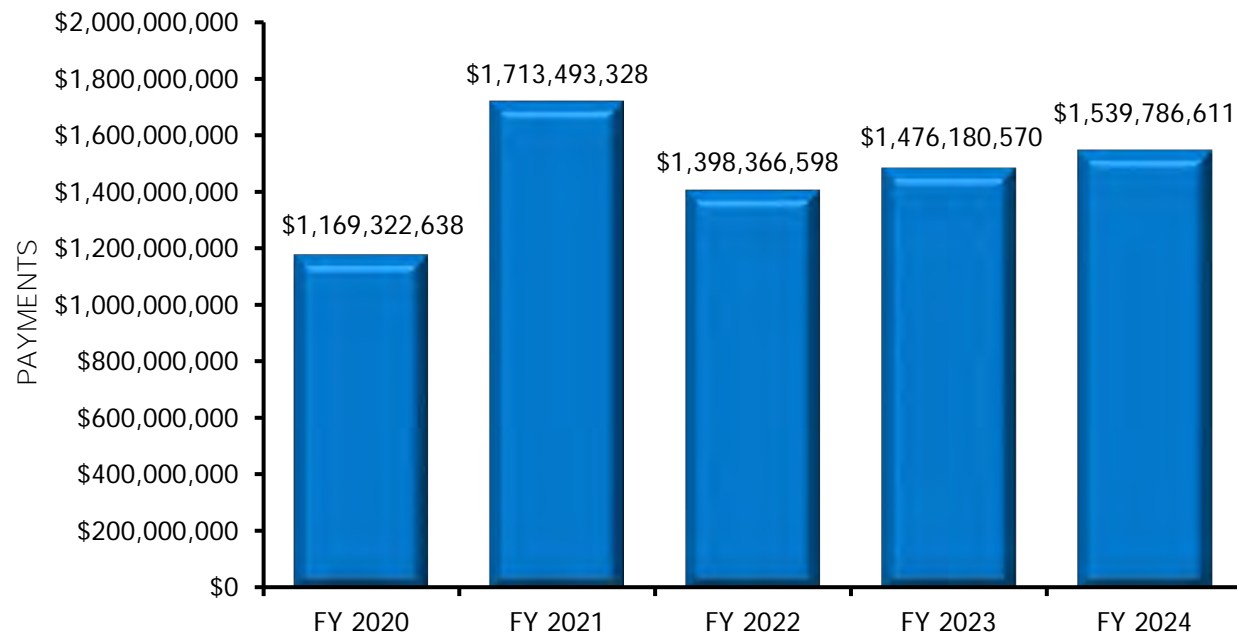

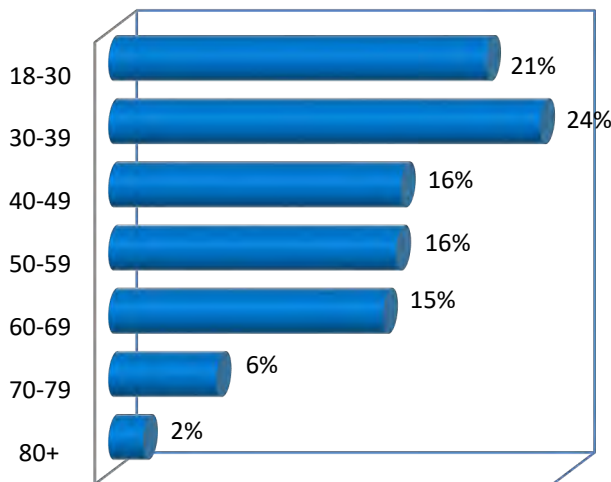
Gender of Adults Receiving Benefits



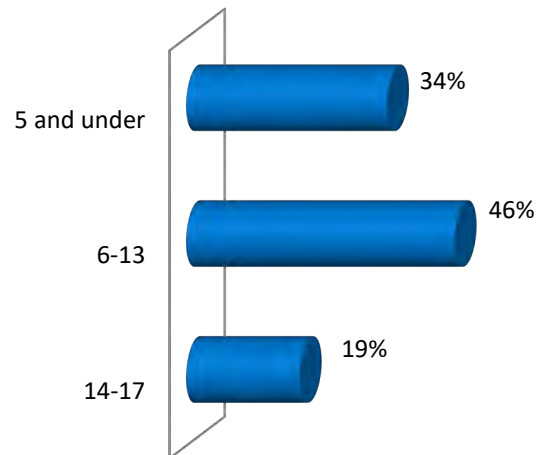
Race of Individuals Receiving Benefits



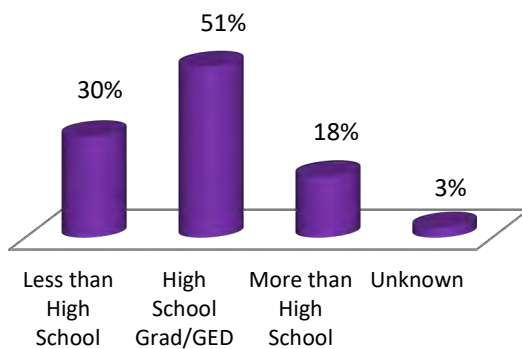
Age of Adults Receiving Benefits

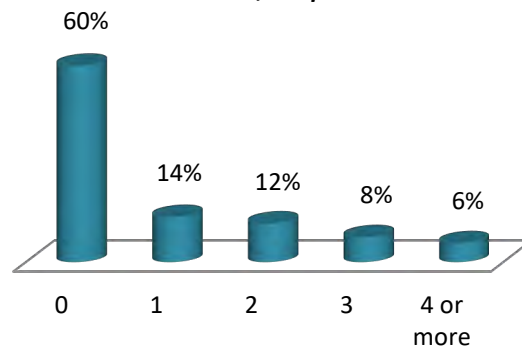
