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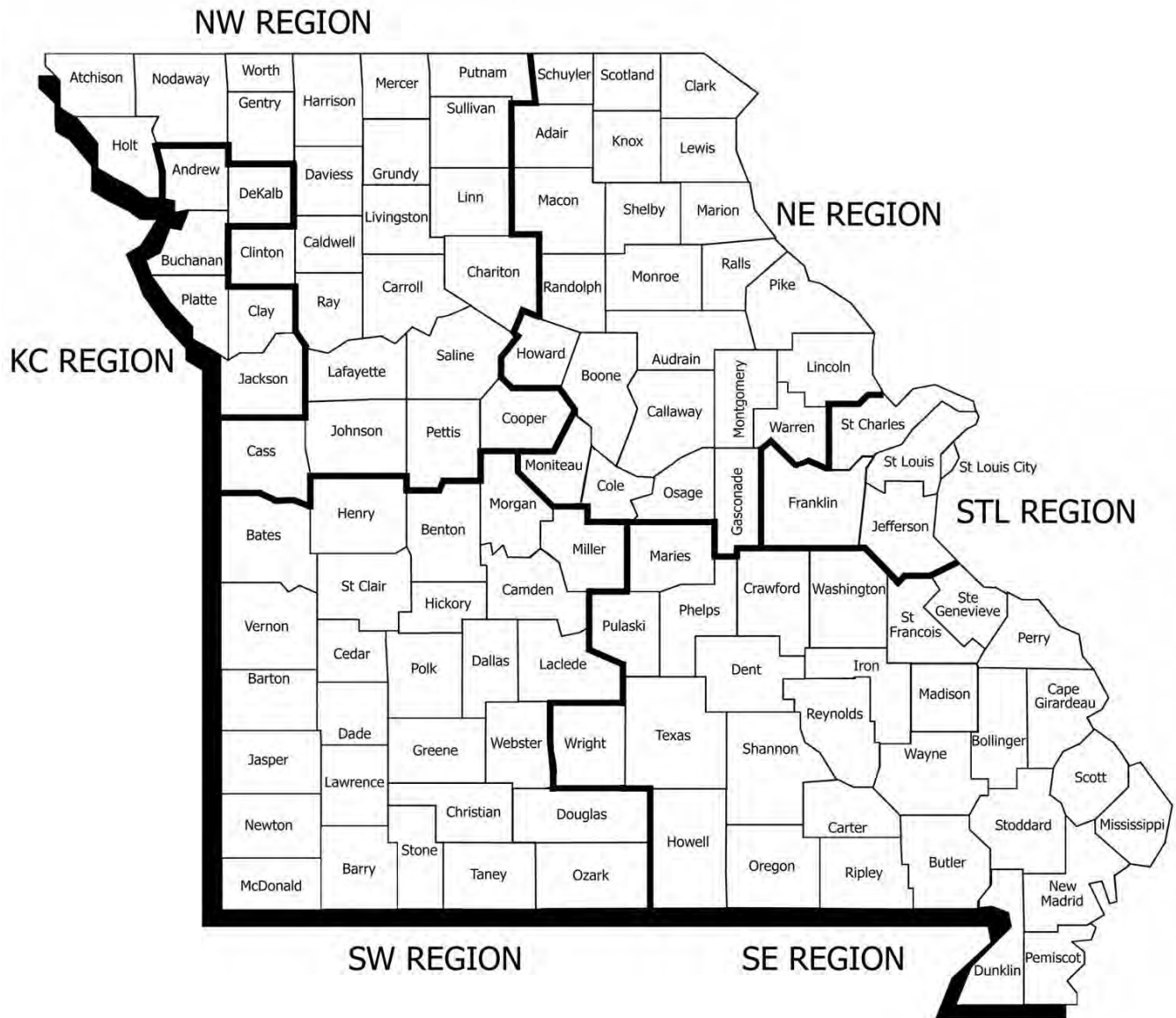

Department of Social Services Regions**

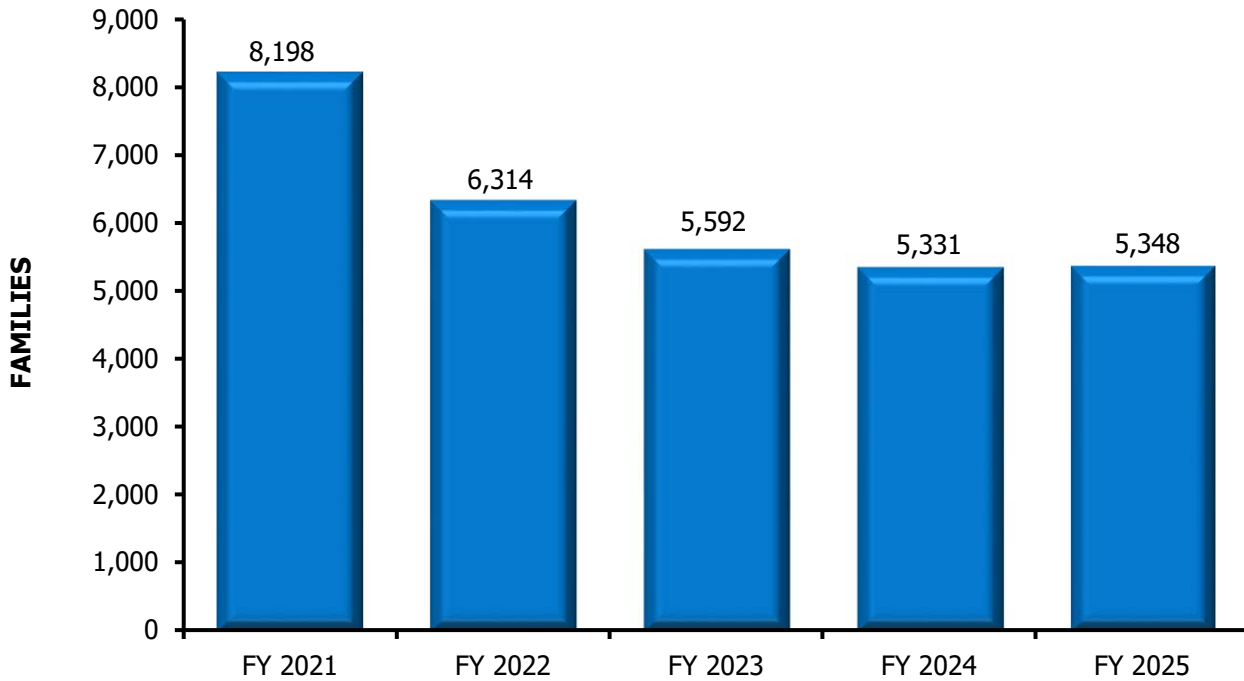


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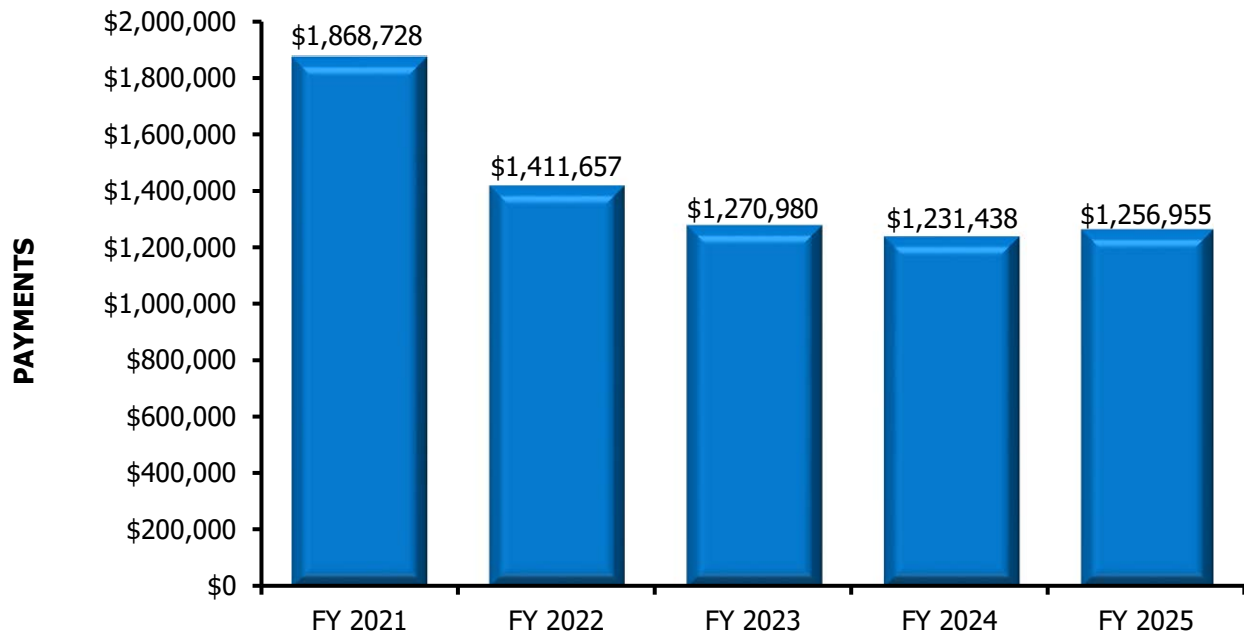

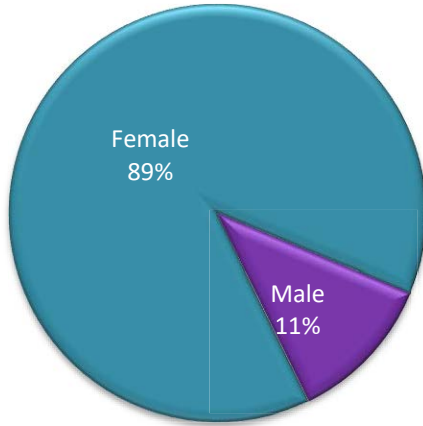

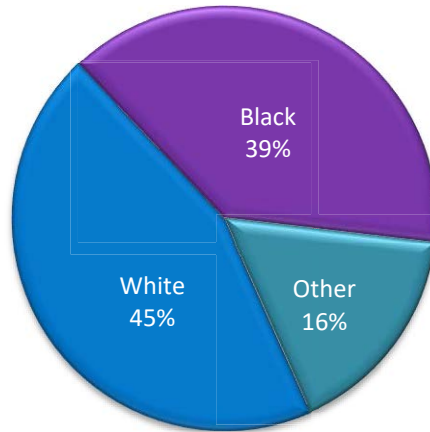

**Figure 4. Representative Missouri Temporary Assistance Characteristics June 2025**

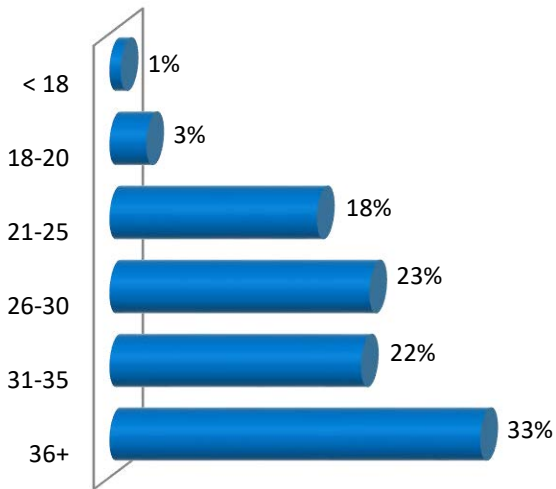
**Gender of TANF Parent(s)/Caretaker(s)**



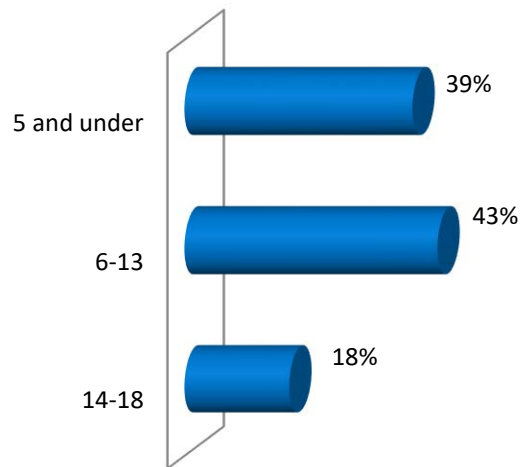
**Race of TANF Participants**



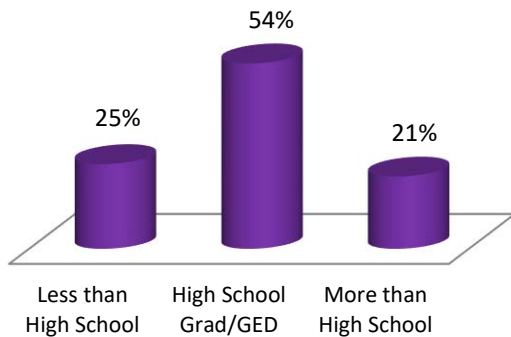

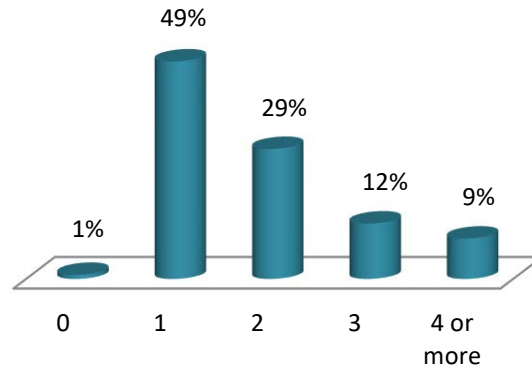

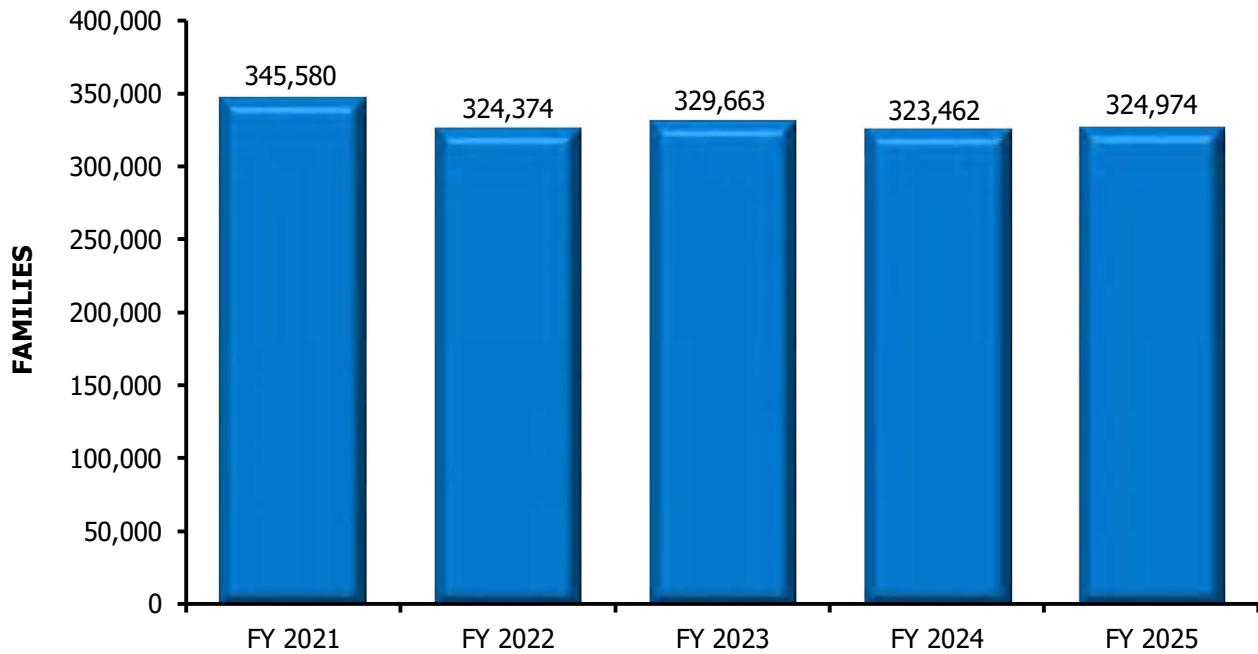

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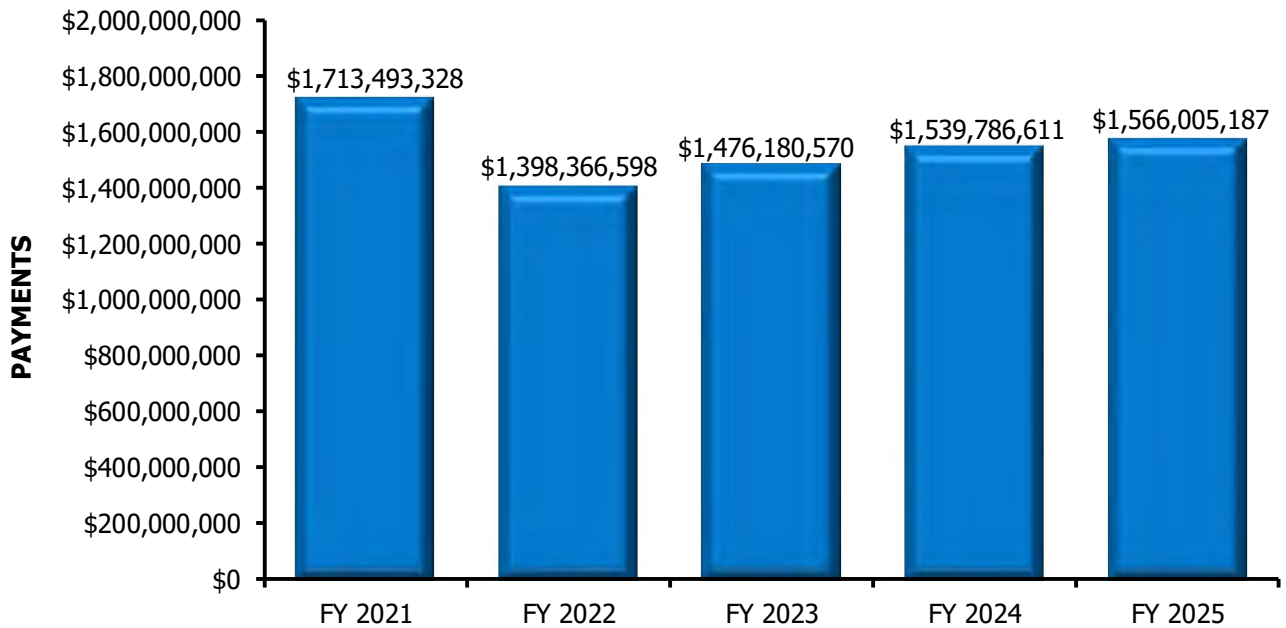

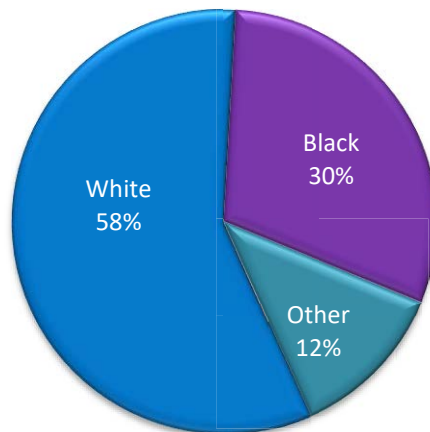

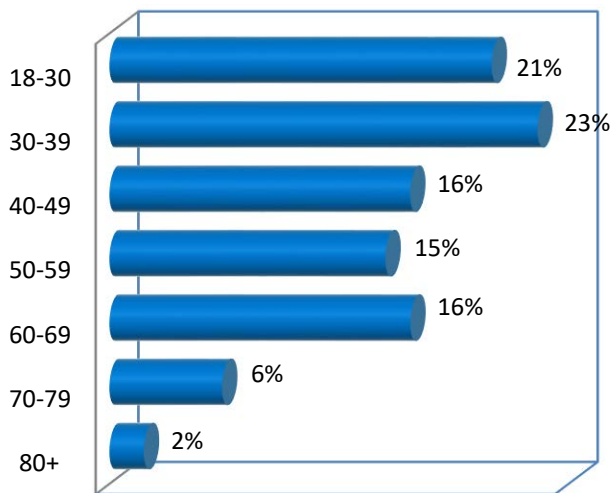
**Gender of Adults Receiving Benefits**



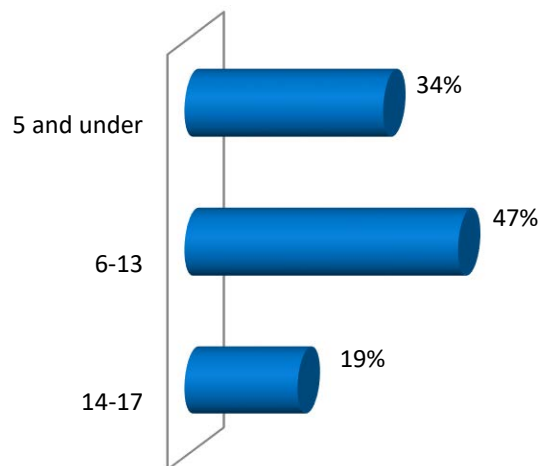

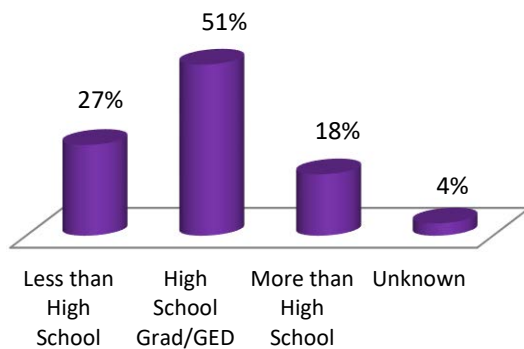

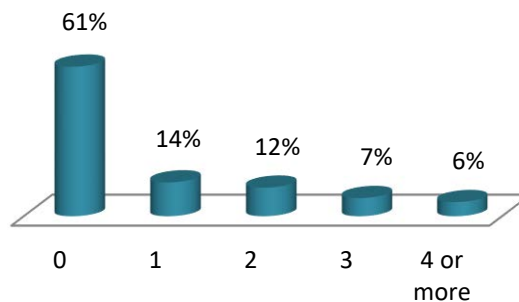
