




Figure 3. Children Served by Facility


Figure 4. Children Served by Provider




Figure 5. Children Served

Figure 6. Block Grant Child Care Payments






Figure 7. Children Served by Region





Figure 9. Children Served Age < 2 by Facility

12-Month Average July 2010-June 2011




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
### Figure 10. Children Served Ages 2-5 by Facility




### Figure 11. Children Served Age > 5 by Facility







Figure 14. Children Served in Group Home by Age




### Figure 15. Children Served by Provider Type

12-Month Average July 2010-June 2011




### Figure 16. Child Care Providers by Type
