


Figure 1. Regions

12-Month Average August 2010-July 2011







Figure 3. Children Served by Facility

12-Month Average August 2010-July 2011







Figure 4. Children Served by Provider

12-Month Average August 2010-July 2011





Figure 5. Children Served




Figure 6. Block Grant Child Care Payments






Figure 7. Children Served by Region



12-Month Average August 2010-July 2011







Figure 9. Children Served Age < 2 by Facility





Figure 10. Children Served Ages 2-5 by Facility





Figure 11. Children Served Age > 5 by Facility




Figure 12. Children Served in Center by Age





Figure 13. Children Served in Family Home by Age

12-Month Average **August 2010-July 2011**







Figure 14. Children Served in Group Home by Age

12-Month Average **August 2010-July 2011**







12-Month Average August 2010-July 2011






Figure 16. Child Care Providers by Type


