

12-Month Average September 2010-August 2011







Figure 3. Children Served by Facility

12-Month Average September 2010-August 2011





Figure 4. Children Served by Provider

12-Month Average September 2010-August 2011



Figure 5. Children Served






Figure 6. Block Grant Child Care Payments



12-Month Average September 2010-August 2011







Figure 9. Children Served Age < 2 by Facility





Figure 10. Children Served Ages 2-5 by Facility

12-Month Average September 2010-August 2011







Figure 11. Children Served Age > 5 by Facility




Figure 12. Children Served in Center by Age





Figure 13. Children Served in Family Home by Age





Figure 14. Children Served in Group Home by Age

12-Month Average September 2010-August 2011







12-Month Average September 2010-August 2011






Figure 16. Child Care Providers by Type


