

Figure 1. Regions





Figure 2. Reason for Child Care

12-Month Average October 2011-September 2012







Figure 3. Children Served by Facility

12-Month Average







Figure 4. Children Served by Provider

12-Month Average October 2011-September 2012





Figure 5. Children Served




Figure 6. Block Grant Child Care Payments






Figure 7. Children Served by Region



12-Month Average October 2011-September 2012







Figure 9. Children Served Age < 2 by Facility

12-Month Average October 2011-September 2012







Figure 10. Children Served Ages 2-5 by Facility

12-Month Average October 2011-September 2012







Figure 11. Children Served Age > 5 by Facility





Figure 12. Children Served in Center by Age

12-Month Average October 2011-September 2012







Figure 13. Children Served in Family Home by Age

12-Month Average October 2011-September 2012







Figure 14. Children Served in Group Home by Age

12-Month Average October 2011-September 2012





Figure 15. TRANSITIONAL HOUSEHOLDS BY REGION





Figure 16. TRANSITIONAL CHILDREN BY REGION



12-Month Average October 2011-September 2012






Figure 18. Child Care Providers by Type


