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





Figure 3. Children Served by Facility



12-Month Average June 2012-May 2013






Figure 6. Block Grant Child Care Payments





Figure 7. Children Served by Region









Figure 9. Children Served Age < 2 by Facility





Figure 11. Children Served Age > 5 by Facility





Figure 12. Children Served in Center by Age





Figure 14. Children Served in Group Home by Age










Figure 17. Children Served by Provider Type


