

Figure 1. Regions





Figure 2. Reason for Child Care

12-Month Average **August 2012-July 2013**






Figure 3. Children Served by Facility





Figure 4. Children Served by Provider

12-Month Average **August 2012-July 2013**



Figure 5. Children Served




Figure 6. Block Grant Child Care Payments






Figure 7. Children Served by Region





Figure 9. Children Served Age < 2 by Facility





Figure 10. Children Served Ages 2-5 by Facility





Figure 11. Children Served Age > 5 by Facility





Figure 12. Children Served in Center by Age




Figure 13. Children Served in Family Home by Age





Figure 14. Children Served in Group Home by Age



Figure 15. TRANSITIONAL HOUSEHOLDS BY REGION





Figure 16. TRANSITIONAL CHILDREN BY REGION



12-Month Average **August 2012-July 2013**







Figure 18. Child Care Providers by Type

12-Month Average **August 2012-July 2013**


