
Figure 1. Regions

12-Month Average February 2013-January 2014






Figure 3. Children Served by Facility





Figure 4. Children Served by Provider



Figure 6. Block Grant Child Care Payments






Figure 7. Children Served by Region





Figure 9. Children Served Age < 2 by Facility





Figure 10. Children Served Ages 2-5 by Facility





Figure 11. Children Served Age > 5 by Facility





Figure 12. Children Served in Center by Age





Figure 13. Children Served in Family Home by Age





Figure 14. Children Served in Group Home by Age



Figure 15. TRANSITIONAL HOUSEHOLDS BY REGION JANUARY 2014





Figure 16. TRANSITIONAL CHILDREN BY REGION JANUARY 2014





Figure 18. Child Care Providers by Type







Figure 21. Children by Reason for Care
