





Figure 2. Reason for Child Care








12-Month Average September 2014-August 2015

Figure 6. Block Grant Child Care Payments





Figure 7. Children Served By Region





12-Month Average September 2014-August 2015







Figure 9. Children Served Age < 2 By Facility





Figure 10. Children Served Ages 2-5 By Facility





Figure 15. TRANSITIONAL HOUSEHOLDS LEVEL 1 BY REGION AUGUST 2015





Figure 16. TRANSITIONAL CHILDREN LEVEL 1 BY REGION AUGUST 2015

Figure 17. TRANSITIONAL HOUSEHOLDS LEVEL 2 BY REGION AUGUST 2015





Figure 18. TRANSITIONAL CHILDREN LEVEL 2 BY REGION AUGUST 2015

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



Figure 20 Child Care Providers By Tyr




Figure 21. Expenditures by Reason for Care


