



Figure 4. Children Served by Provider

Figure 5. Children Served




Figure 6. Block Grant Child Care Payments





Figure 7. Children Served By Region








Figure 9. Children Served Age < 2 By Facility





Figure 10. Children Served Ages 2-5 By Facility





Figure 13. Children Served in Family Home By Age



Figure 15. TRANSITIONAL HOUSEHOLDS LEVEL 1 BY REGION SEPTEMBER 2015





Figure 16. TRANSITIONAL CHILDREN LEVEL 1 BY REGION SEPTEMBER 2015

Figure 17. TRANSITIONAL HOUSEHOLDS LEVEL 2 BY REGION SEPTEMBER 2015






Figure 18. TRANSITIONAL CHILDREN LEVEL 2 BY REGION SEPTEMBER 2015






Figure 21. Expenditures by Reason for Care


