








12-Month Average December 2015-November 2016



Figure 5. Children Served







Figure 7. Children Served By Region








Figure 9. Children Served Age < 2 By Facility





Figure 11. Children Served Ages > 5 By Facility








Figure 13. Children Served in Family Home By Age





Figure 14. Children Served in Group Home By Age





Figure 16. Transitional Children Summary by Region November 2016





Figure 18. Transitional Children Level 1 by Region November 2016





Figure 20. Transitional Children Level 2 by Region November 2016






Figure 22. Transitional Children Level 3 by Region November 2016








Figure 25. Expenditures by Reason for Care






