






Figure 4. Children Served by Provider






Figure 5. Children Served





Figure 7. Children Served By Region













Figure 9. Children Served Age < 2 By Facility







Figure 11. Children Served Ages > 5 By Facility






Figure 13. Children Served in Family Home By Age




Figure 14. Children Served in Group Home By Age



Figure 15. Transitional Households by Level October 2022






Figure 16. Transitional Children by Level October 2022

Figure 18. Child Care Providers By Type





Figure 20. Households by Reason for Care







Figure 21. Children by Reason for Care
