

Figure 1. Regions





Figure 2. Reason for Child Care



12-Month Average October 2021 - September 2022







Figure 3. Children Served by Facility

12-Month Average October 2021 - September 2022







Figure 4. Children Served by Provider

12-Month Average October 2021 - September 2022





Figure 6. Child Care Payments





Figure 7. Children Served By Region



12-Month Average October 2021 - September 2022





12-Month Average October 2021 - September 2022







Figure 9. Children Served Age < 2 By Facility





Figure 10. Children Served Ages 2-5 By Facility





Figure 11. Children Served Ages > 5 By Facility





Figure 12. Children Served in Center By Age





Figure 13. Children Served in Family Home By Age





Figure 14. Children Served in Group Home By Age



Figure 15. Transitional Households by Level September 2022






Figure 16. Transitional Children by Level September 2022

12-Month Average October 2021 - September 2022







Figure 18. Child Care Providers By Type






Figure 20. Households by Reason for Care





Figure 21. Children by Reason for Care
