



Figure 1. Regions




Figure 2. Reason for Child Care




Figure 3. Children Served by Facility




Figure 4. Children Served by Provider



Figure 5. Children Served




Figure 6. Child Care Payments





Figure 7. Children Served By Region

#### 12-Month Average July 2019 - June 2020









Figure 9. Children Served Age < 2 By Facility





Figure 10. Children Served Ages 2-5 By Facility





Figure 11. Children Served Ages > 5 By Facility




Figure 12. Children Served in Center By Age




Figure 13. Children Served in Family Home By Age




Figure 14. Children Served in Group Home By Age



Figure 15. Transitional Households by Region June 2020





Figure 16. Transitional Children by Region June 2020

Figure 17. Children Served By Provider Type




Figure 18. Child Care Providers By Type







Figure 21. Children by Reason for Care
