
















#### **12-Month Average** November 2018 - October 2019








**Figure 5. Children Served** 






### Figure 7. Children Served By Region






Figure 9. Children Served Age < 2 By Facility



12-Month Average November 2018 - October 2019







Figure 11. Children Served Ages > 5 By Facility










Figure 14. Children Served in Group Home By Age







#### Figure 18. Transitional Children Level 1 by Region October 2019





#### Figure 20. Transitional Children Level 2 by Region October 2019









Figure 24. Child Care Providers By Type




#### Figure 25. Expenditures by Reason for Care


#### Figure 26. Households by Reason for Care
