










Figure 5. Children Served







Figure 9. Children Served Age < 2 By Facility






Figure 13. Children Served in Family Home By Age




Figure 14. Children Served in Group Home By Age





Figure 22. Transitional Children Level 3 by Region December 2018




Figure 24. Child Care Providers By Type







December 2018




