Cassidy: Looking Foward

Cassidy, a single mom, was looking for a job during the pandemic. She found out she was eligible for the SkillUP program and was connected to a Workforce Specialist who helped her complete job applications.

In October 2020, she got a job as a Youth Services Counselor, which boasts a consistent schedule, paid time off, and health insurance. The SkillUP program even helped Cassidy purchase the work attire she needed.

"The help that I received and the new job that I have has made me realize that I eventually want to go back to school and obtain a degree in social work," Cassidy says.
